- An extensive fire which destroys a great deal of land or property.






## Synonyms of "Conflagration" as a noun (6 Words)

blaze	Noisy and unrestrained mischief. Their relationship broke up in a <b>blaze</b> of publicity.
fire	A fireplace in which a relatively small fire is burning. The whisky lit a <b>fire</b> in the back of his throat.
firestorm	A storm in which violent winds are drawn into the column of hot air rising over a severely bombed area. <i>The incident ignited a firestorm of controversy.</i>
<u>flames</u>	The process of combustion of inflammable materials producing heat and light and (often) smoke.
holocaust	A Jewish sacrificial offering that was burned completely on an altar. <i>A nuclear <b>holocaust</b></i> .



**inferno** A very intense and uncontrolled fire. The **inferno** of the Friday evening rush hour.

# Associations of "Conflagration" (30 Words)

<u>ablaze</u>	Very brightly coloured or lighted. Streets <b>ablaze</b> with lighted Christmas trees.
afire	Lighted up by or as by fire or flame. The whole mill was <b>afire</b> .
aflame	Keenly excited (especially sexually) or indicating excitement- Bram Stoker. <i>Pour brandy over the steaks and then set</i> <b>aflame</b> .
alight	Lighted up by or as by fire or flame. <i>Visitors should <b>alight</b> at the Fort Road stop.</i>



<u>bask</u>	Lie exposed to warmth and light, typically from the sun, for relaxation and pleasure. He went on <b>bask</b> ing in the glory of his first book.
blaze	Indicate by marking trees with blazes. The sun <b>blaze</b> d down.
calamitous	(of events) having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. Such <b>calamitous</b> events as fires hurricanes and floods.
<u>caustic</u>	A caustic surface or curve. <b>Caustic</b> jokes about political assassination talk show hosts and medical ethics.
crushing	Physically or spiritually devastating; often used in combination. A <b>crushing</b> blow.
<u>demon</u>	A cruel, evil, or unmanageable person. He worked like a <b>demon</b> to finish the job on time.
<u>destructive</u>	Causing great and irreparable damage. <i>The <b>destructive</b> power of weapons.</i>
devastate	Cause extensive destruction or ruin utterly. She was <b>devastate</b> d by the loss of Damian.
douse	Cover with liquid; pour liquid onto. Stewards appeared and the fire was <b>douse</b> d.
extinguish	Extinguish by crushing. A look which would have <b>extinguish</b> ed any man.
firefighter	A member of a fire department who tries to extinguish fires.
<u>flame</u>	Shine or glow like a flame. Your opinions and mine are probably different but please don t <b>flame</b> me.
flaming	Informal intensifiers. Her <b>flaming</b> hair.
<u>flare</u>	Become flared and widen usually at one end. Every star seemed to <b>flare</b> with new intensity.
incandescence	The phenomenon of light emission by a body as its temperature is raised.
<u>inferno</u>	(Christianity) the abode of Satan and the forces of evil; where sinners suffer eternal punishment. The <b>inferno</b> of the engine room.
perdition	The abode of Satan and the forces of evil; where sinners suffer eternal punishment- John Milton. Hurl d headlong To bottomless <b>perdition</b> there to dwell.



<u>pit</u>	A person s armpit. They dug a <b>pit</b> to bury the body.
<u>purgatory</u>	(in Catholic doctrine) a place or state of suffering inhabited by the souls of sinners who are explaining their sins before going to heaven. <i>Infernal punishments are <b>purgatory</b> and medicinal.</i>
pyrotechnic	Of or relating to the craft of making fireworks. <b>Pyrotechnic</b> keyboard virtuosity.
rekindle	Relight (a fire. <b>Rekindle</b> her love.
ruinous	In ruins; dilapidated. A <b>ruinous</b> effect on the environment.
smoulder	Smoke coming from a smouldering fire. The controversy <b>smoulder</b> ed on for several years.
tinder	Material for starting a fire. <i>He lit it with a <b>tinder</b>.</i>
underworld	The world of criminals or of organized crime. A man reputed to be a godfather of the Glasgow <b>underworld</b> .
