The music faded in **discord**.

Not in agreement or harmony.

discordant
The singers continued their discordant chanting.

discrepancy A difference between conflicting facts or claims or opinions.

There s a **discrepancy** between your account and his.



Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in

disputatious law suits.

A disputatious lawyer.

dissension Disagreement that leads to discord.

The mill was the cause of a **dissension** in 1620.

dissonance Lack of agreement or harmony between people or things.

A session full of jangling **dissonance**s.

dissonant Characterized by musical dissonance; harmonically unresolved.

Jackson employs both harmonious and dissonant colour choices.

factious Dissenting (especially dissenting with the majority opinion.

A factious country.

fight The inclination or ability to fight or struggle.

A churchman who has dedicated his life to **fight**ing racism.

hostile Showing or feeling opposition or dislike; unfriendly.

The brewery fought off a **hostile** takeover bid last year.

Used especially of solids or solutions; incapable of blending into a stable

incompatible homogeneous mixture.

Incompatible personalities.

(of ideas or statements) so different from each other that they cannot be

irreconcilable made compatible.

Irreconcilable differences.

A body of people united in opposing something.

Despite **opposition** from the newspapers he went ahead.

An angry dispute.

Some people **quarrel** with this approach.

Given to or characterized by guarrelling.

quarrelsome

A moody quarrelsome man.

Engage in a skirmish.
