## Associations of "Conflicted" (30 Words)

<a href="#">argument</a>	An independent variable associated with a function or proposition and determining its value For example in the expression $y = F(x)$ the arguments of the function $F$ are $x$ and $x$ and the value is $y$ . <i>There is a strong <b>argument</b> for submitting a formal appeal.</i>
<b>clash</b>	Disagree violently. <i>It is hoped that <b>clashes</b> of dates will be avoided.</i>
<b>collide</b>	Cause to collide. <i>The physicists <b>collided</b> the particles.</i>
<a href="#">contend</a>	Assert something as a position in an argument. <i>He <b>contended</b> that Communism had no future.</i>
<a href="#">controversy</a>	A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement. <i>The design of the building has caused <b>controversy</b>.</i>
<b>counterattack</b>	Make a counterattack.
<b>crash</b>	Move with or as if with a crashing noise. <i>Mother <b>crashed</b> the motorbike into the lamppost.</i>
<a href="#">disagree</a>	Have or express a different opinion. <i>She <b>disagrees</b> with her husband on many questions.</i>
<a href="#">disagreement</a>	Lack of consensus or approval. <i>There was some <b>disagreement</b> about the details.</i>
<a href="#">discord</a>	A harsh mixture of sounds. <i>The music faded in <b>discord</b>.</i>
<a href="#">discordant</a>	Not in agreement or harmony. <i>The singers continued their <b>discordant</b> chanting.</i>
<b>discrepancy</b>	A difference between conflicting facts or claims or opinions. <i>There s a <b>discrepancy</b> between your account and his.</i>

<b>disputatious</b>	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. <i>A <b>disputatious</b> lawyer.</i>
<b>dissension</b>	Disagreement that leads to discord. <i>The mill was the cause of a <b>dissension</b> in 1620.</i>
<b>dissonance</b>	Lack of agreement or harmony between people or things. <i>A session full of jangling <b>dissonances</b>.</i>
<b>dissonant</b>	Characterized by musical dissonance; harmonically unresolved. <i>Jackson employs both harmonious and <b>dissonant</b> colour choices.</i>
<b>factious</b>	Dissenting (especially dissenting with the majority opinion). <i>A <b>factious</b> country.</i>
<b>fight</b>	The inclination or ability to fight or struggle. <i>A churchman who has dedicated his life to <b>fighting</b> racism.</i>
<b>hostile</b>	Showing or feeling opposition or dislike; unfriendly. <i>The brewery fought off a <b>hostile</b> takeover bid last year.</i>
<b>incompatible</b>	Used especially of solids or solutions; incapable of blending into a stable homogeneous mixture. <i><b>Incompatible</b> personalities.</i>
<b>irreconcilable</b>	(of ideas or statements) so different from each other that they cannot be made compatible. <i><b>Irreconcilable</b> differences.</i>
<b>opposition</b>	A body of people united in opposing something. <i>Despite <b>opposition</b> from the newspapers he went ahead.</i>
<b>quarrel</b>	An angry dispute. <i>Some people <b>quarrel</b> with this approach.</i>
<b>quarrelsome</b>	Given to or characterized by quarrelling. <i>A moody <b>quarrelsome</b> man.</i>
<b>skirmish</b>	Engage in a skirmish. <i>Protesters <b>skirmished</b> with a group of bystanders opposed to their march.</i>
<b>strife</b>	Trouble or difficulty of any kind. <i><b>Strife</b> within the community.</i>
<b>struggle</b>	Engage in conflict. <i>There were signs of a <b>struggle</b> and there was a lot of blood around.</i>
<b>vie</b>	Compete for something; engage in a contest; measure oneself against others. <i>The athletes were vying for a place in the British team.</i>

**wrangle**

A dispute or argument, typically one that is long and complicated.  
*An insurance **wrangle** is holding up compensation payments.*

**wrestle**

Struggle with a difficulty or problem.  
*The security guards **wrestled** them to the ground.*
