## Synonyms of "Conformist" as an adjective (10 Words)

<b>conservative</b>	<i>The film was not cheap 30 000 is a <b>conservative</b> estimate.</i> (of a bid) intended to convey a particular meaning according to an agreed convention.

<b>customary</b>	In accordance with convention or custom. <i>It is <b>customary</b> to mark an occasion like this with a toast.</i>
<b>established</b>	Brought about or set up or accepted especially long established. <i>America had no <b>established</b> Church.</i>
<b>normal</b>	Conforming with or constituting a norm or standard or level or type or social norm not abnormal. <i><b>Normal</b> curiosity.</i>
<b>orthodox</b>	Of or pertaining to or characteristic of Judaism. <i><b>Orthodox</b> medical treatment.</i>
<b>regular</b>	In accord with regular practice or procedure. <i>A <b>regular</b> soldier.</i>
<b>standard</b>	Conforming to or constituting a standard of measurement or value or of the usual or regularized or accepted kind. <i>It is <b>standard</b> practice in museums to register objects as they are acquired.</i>

<b>accede</b>	To agree or express agreement. <i>Albania <b>acceded</b> to the IMF in 1990.</i>
<b>accept</b>	Make use of or accept for some purpose. <i>The college <b>accepted</b> her as a student.</i>
<b>accord</b>	Agreement or harmony. <i>His views <b>accorded</b> well with those of Merivale.</i>

<b>acquiesce</b>	Accept something reluctantly but without protest. <i>Sara <b>acquiesced</b> in his decision.</i>
<b>acquiescent</b>	Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest. <i>Too <b>acquiescent</b> to challenge authority.</i>
<b><u>admissible</u></b>	Acceptable or valid, especially as evidence in a court of law. <i>The tape recording was <b>admissible</b> as evidence.</i>
<b>admittedly</b>	As acknowledged. <i><b>Admittedly</b> the salary was not wonderful.</i>
<b><u>agree</u></b>	Show grammatical agreement. <i>If they had <b>agreed</b> a price the deal would have gone through.</i>
<b><u>agreed</u></b>	(of two or more parties) holding the same view or opinion on something. <i>We are <b>agreed</b> that what is needed is a catchy title.</i>
<b><u>approbation</u></b>	Official recognition or approval. <i>A term of <b>approbation</b>.</i>
<b>approve</b>	Prove; show. <i>The budget was <b>approved</b> by parliament.</i>
<b>assent</b>	Agreement with a statement or proposal to do something. <i>The Prime Minister <b>assented</b> to the change.</i>
<b>compliance</b>	Excessive acquiescence. <i>The appalling <b>compliance</b> with government views shown by the commission.</i>
<b>compliant</b>	Having the property of compliance. <i>Children <b>compliant</b> with the parental will.</i>
<b>comply</b>	Act in accordance with a wish or command. <i>We are unable to <b>comply</b> with your request.</i>
<b><u>configuration</u></b>	The fixed three-dimensional relationship of the atoms in a molecule, defined by the bonds between them. <i>The outcome depends on the <b>configuration</b> of influences at the time.</i>
<b><u>conform</u></b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The changes were introduced to <b>conform</b> with international classifications.</i>
<b>conformance</b>	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i><b>Conformance</b> testing.</i>
<b>conforming</b>	Adhering to established customs or doctrines (especially in religion).
<b>conformism</b>	Orthodoxy in thoughts and belief.
<b><u>consent</u></b>	Give an affirmative reply to; respond favorably to. <i>He had <b>consented</b> to serve as external assessor on the panel.</i>



<b><u>correspond</u></b>	Take the place of or be parallel or equivalent to. <i>Margaret <b>corresponded</b> with him until his death.</i>
<b><u>denomination</u></b>	A group of religious congregations having its own organization and a distinctive faith. <i>He flashed a fistful of bills of large <b>denominations</b>.</i>
<b>follow</b>	Choose and follow as of theories ideas policies strategies or plans. <i>Her bad deed <b>followed</b> her and haunted her dreams all her life.</i>
<b>ideology</b>	Imaginary or visionary theorization. <i>The <b>ideology</b> of republicanism.</i>
<b>obediently</b>	In a manner that shows willingness to comply with an order or request; submissively. <i><b>Obediently</b> she slipped off her right shoe and stocking.</i>
<b>orthodox</b>	Relating to Orthodox Judaism. <i>An <b>orthodox</b> view of the world.</i>
<b>permission</b>	An official document giving authorization. <i>He received <b>permission</b> to go to Brussels.</i>
<b>resignedly</b>	With resignation and acceptance; in a resigned manner.
<b>submission</b>	The action of presenting a proposal, application, or other document for consideration or judgement. <i>What was the date of <b>submission</b> of your proposal.</i>
