abidance	Acting according to certain accepted standards.
accordance	Conformity or agreement. <i>There is good accordance between the values.</i>
alphabet	A character set that includes letters and is used to write a language. <i>DNA s 4 letter alphabet.</i>
assuring	Giving confidence.
compliance	The state or fact of according with or meeting rules or standards. <i>The appalling compliance with government views shown by the commission.</i>
concordance	Make a concordance of a text. <i>His works are extremely well known and have been concordanced.</i>
conform	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The pressure to conform.</i>
deference	A courteous expression (by word or deed) of esteem or regard. <i>He addressed her with the deference due to age.</i>
dictionary	A set of words or other text strings made for use in applications such as spellcheckers. <i>A dictionary of quotations.</i>
diphthong	A digraph representing the sound of a diphthong or single vowel as in feat.
equity	A branch of law that developed alongside common law and is concerned with fairness and justice, formerly administered in special courts. <i>He owns 62 of the group s equity.</i>
etymology	The origin of a word and the historical development of its meaning. <i>The etymology of the word devil.</i>
follow	Follow with the eyes or the mind. <i>They follow their March show with four UK dates next month.</i>

grammar	A grammar school. <i>It was not bad grammar just dialect.</i>
impartiality	Equal treatment of all rivals or disputants; fairness. <i>Entries had to be submitted under a pseudonym to ensure impartiality in the judging process.</i>
<u>justice</u>	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>The justice of his case.</i>
neutrality	The condition of being chemically or electrically neutral. <i>The clinical neutrality of the description.</i>
<u>obedience</u>	Behavior intended to please your parents. <i>Their children were never very strong on obedience.</i>
<u>obey</u>	Behave in accordance with (a general principle, natural law, etc). <i>The officer was convicted for refusing to obey orders.</i>
<u>objectivity</u>	Judgment based on observable phenomena and uninfluenced by emotions or personal prejudices. <i>The piece lacked any objectivity.</i>
<u>observance</u>	Respect; deference. <i>The tramp gave them no observance.</i>
orthography	The conventional spelling system of a language. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned orthography.</i>
<u>socialization</u>	The activity of mixing socially with others. <i>The socialization of medical services.</i>
<u>spelling</u>	The process or activity of writing or naming the letters of a word. <i>The spelling of his name was influenced by French.</i>
submission	A proposition or argument presented by counsel to a judge or jury. <i>Several of his submissions were rejected by publishers.</i>
<u>syntax</u>	The branch of linguistics that deals with syntax. <i>Generative syntax.</i>
typo	A typographical error.
vocabulary	The system of techniques or symbols serving as a means of expression (as in arts or crafts). <i>The Sanskrit vocabulary.</i>
vowel	A letter representing a vowel sound such as a e i o u.
word	A secret word or phrase known only to a restricted group. <i>Don't believe a word of it.</i>
