## Associations of "Confrontational" (30 Words)

<b>aggressive</b>	Characteristic of an enemy or one eager to fight. <i><b>Aggressive</b> acts against another country.</i>
<b>antagonistic</b>	Used especially of drugs or muscles that counteract or neutralize each other's effect. <i>His <b>antagonistic</b> brusqueness.</i>
<b>argumentative</b>	Using or characterized by systematic reasoning. <i>An <b>argumentative</b> child.</i>
<b>barbaric</b>	Uncivilized and uncultured. <i>Drinking undiluted wine was considered <b>barbaric</b>.</i>
<b>bellicose</b>	Having or showing a ready disposition to fight. <i>A mood of <b>bellicose</b> jingoism.</i>
<b>belligerent</b>	Engaged in war. <i>The mood at the meeting was <b>belligerent</b>.</i>
<b>combatant</b>	Engaging in or ready for combat. <i>In the long Russo Swedish conflict both <b>combatants</b> endured terrible sacrifices.</i>
<b>combative</b>	Having or showing a ready disposition to fight. <i>He made some enemies with his <b>combative</b> style.</i>
<b>competitive</b>	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>Highly <b>competitive</b> sales representative.</i>
<b>contentious</b>	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. <i>A central and <b>contentious</b> element of the book.</i>
<b>crossfire</b>	Fire from two or more points so that the lines of fire cross. <i>A photographer was killed in <b>crossfire</b>.</i>
<b>disputatious</b>	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. <i>It s a congenial hang out for <b>disputatious</b> academics.</i>

<b><u>divisive</u></b>	Tending to cause disagreement or hostility between people. <i>The highly <b>divisive</b> issue of abortion.</i>
<b>expansionist</b>	A follower or advocate of a policy of territorial or economic expansion. <i>He was an aggressive <b>expansionist</b>.</i>
<b>factious</b>	Dissenting (especially dissenting with the majority opinion). <i>A <b>factious</b> country.</i>
<b><u>fiercely</u></b>	In a powerful and destructive manner. <i>Campaigners have <b>fiercely</b> opposed the proposals.</i>
<b><u>hostile</u></b>	Of or belonging to a military enemy. <i>A <b>hostile</b> remark.</i>
<b><u>hostility</u></b>	A hostile (very unfriendly) disposition. <i>He could not conceal his <b>hostility</b>.</i>
<b>intimidating</b>	Having a frightening, overawing, or threatening effect. <i>Public speaking is an <b>intimidating</b> experience.</i>
<b>litigious</b>	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. <i>A <b>litigious</b> and acrimonious spirit.</i>
<b><u>menacing</u></b>	Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening. <i>His tone became <b>menacing</b>.</i>
<b><u>militant</u></b>	A militant reformer. <i><b>Militant</b> in fighting for better wages for workers.</i>
<b>offense</b>	An act punishable by law; usually considered an evil act.
<b>pugnacious</b>	Ready and able to resort to force or violence- Herman Melville. <i><b>Pugnacious</b> spirits lamented that there was so little prospect of an exhilarating disturbance.</i>
<b>quarrelsome</b>	Given to quarreling. <i><b>Quarrelsome</b> when drinking.</i>
<b><u>repel</u></b>	Be repellent to cause aversion in. <i>Like poles <b>repel</b> and unlike poles attract.</i>
<b>scrappy</b>	Determined, argumentative, or pugnacious. <i><b>Scrappy</b> lecture notes piled up unread.</i>
<b><u>truculent</u></b>	Defiantly aggressive. <i>A <b>truculent</b> speech against the new government.</i>
<b><u>warlike</u></b>	Disposed to warfare or hard-line policies. <i><b>Warlike</b> policies.</i>
<b><u>warring</u></b>	Engaged in war. <i>Belligerent or <b>warring</b> nations.</i>
