aggressive	Characteristic of an enemy or one eager to fight. <i>Aggressive</i> acts against another country.
antagonistic	Used especially of drugs or muscles that counteract or neutralize each other's effect. <i>His antagonistic</i> brusqueness.
argumentative	Using or characterized by systematic reasoning. An argumentative child.
barbaric	Uncivilized and uncultured. Drinking undiluted wine was considered barbaric .
bellicose	Having or showing a ready disposition to fight. A mood of bellicose jingoism.
belligerent	Engaged in war. The mood at the meeting was belligerent .
combatant	Engaging in or ready for combat. In the long Russo Swedish conflict both combatant s endured terrible sacrifices.
combative	Having or showing a ready disposition to fight. <i>He made some enemies with his combative style.</i>
competitive	Involving competition or competitiveness. Highly competitive sales representative.
<u>contentious</u>	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. A central and contentious element of the book.
crossfire	Fire from two or more points so that the lines of fire cross. A photographer was killed in crossfire .
disputatious	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. It s a congenial hang out for disputatious academics.



<u>divisive</u>	Tending to cause disagreement or hostility between people. <i>The highly divisive issue of abortion.</i>
expansionist	A follower or advocate of a policy of territorial or economic expansion. <i>He was an aggressive expansionist</i> .
factious	Dissenting (especially dissenting with the majority opinion. A factious country.
<u>fiercely</u>	In a powerful and destructive manner. Campaigners have fiercely opposed the proposals.
<u>hostile</u>	Of or belonging to a military enemy. A hostile remark.
<u>hostility</u>	A hostile (very unfriendly) disposition. <i>He could not conceal his hostility.</i>
intimidating	Having a frightening, overawing, or threatening effect. <i>Public speaking is an intimidating experience.</i>
litigious	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. A litigious and acrimonious spirit.
<u>menacing</u>	Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening. <i>His tone became menacing</i> .
<u>militant</u>	A militant reformer. Militant in fighting for better wages for workers.
offense	An act punishable by law; usually considered an evil act.
pugnacious	Ready and able to resort to force or violence- Herman Melville. Pugnacious spirits lamented that there was so little prospect of an exhilarating disturbance.
quarrelsome	Given to quarreling. Quarrelsome when drinking.
<u>repel</u>	Be repellent to cause aversion in. Like poles repel and unlike poles attract.
scrappy	Determined, argumentative, or pugnacious. Scrappy lecture notes piled up unread.
<u>truculent</u>	Defiantly aggressive. A truculent speech against the new government.
<u>warlike</u>	Disposed to warfare or hard-line policies. <i>Warlike</i> policies.
<u>warring</u>	Engaged in war. Belligerent or warring nations.
