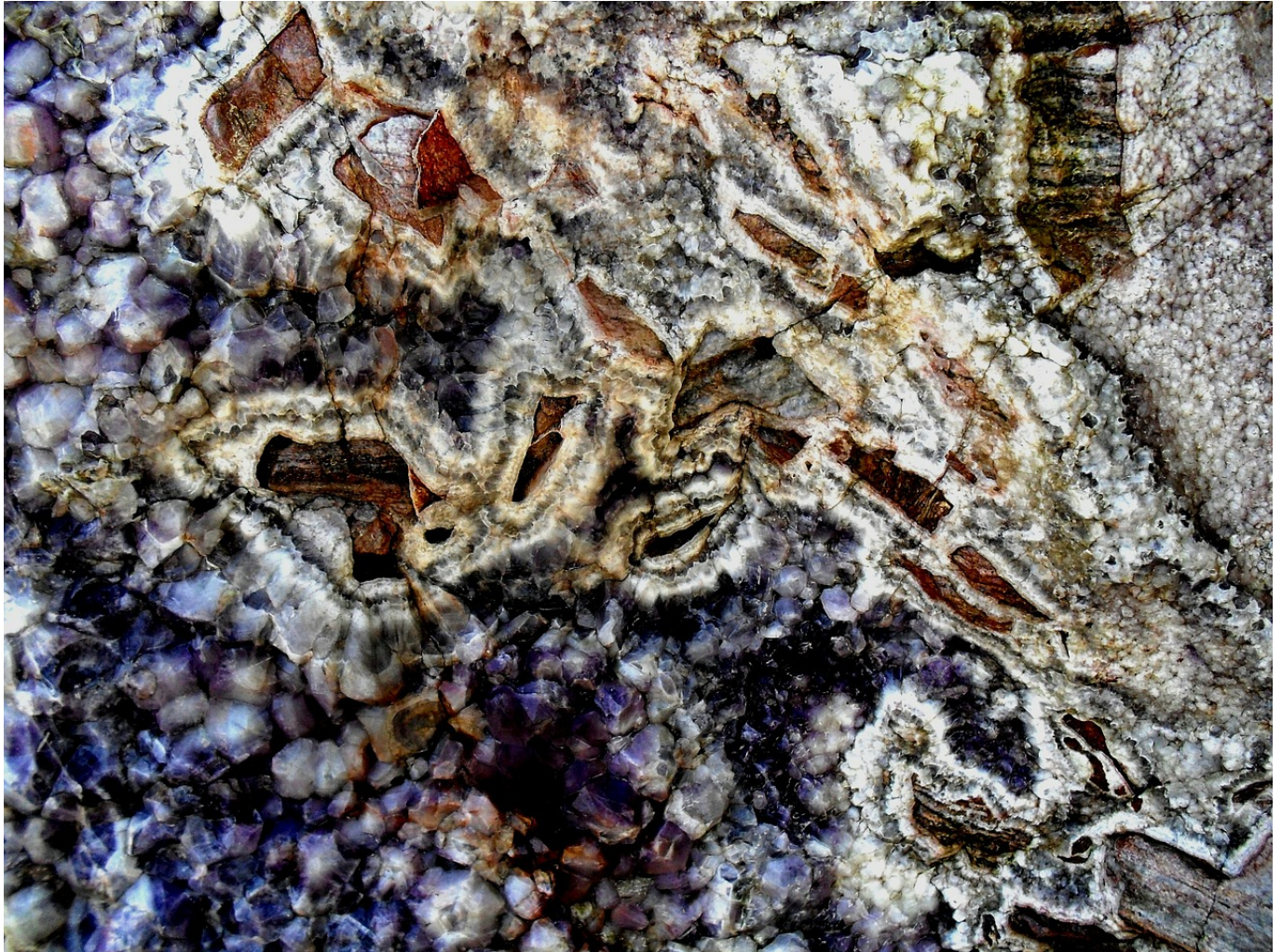

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “conglomeration” as a noun can have the following definitions:

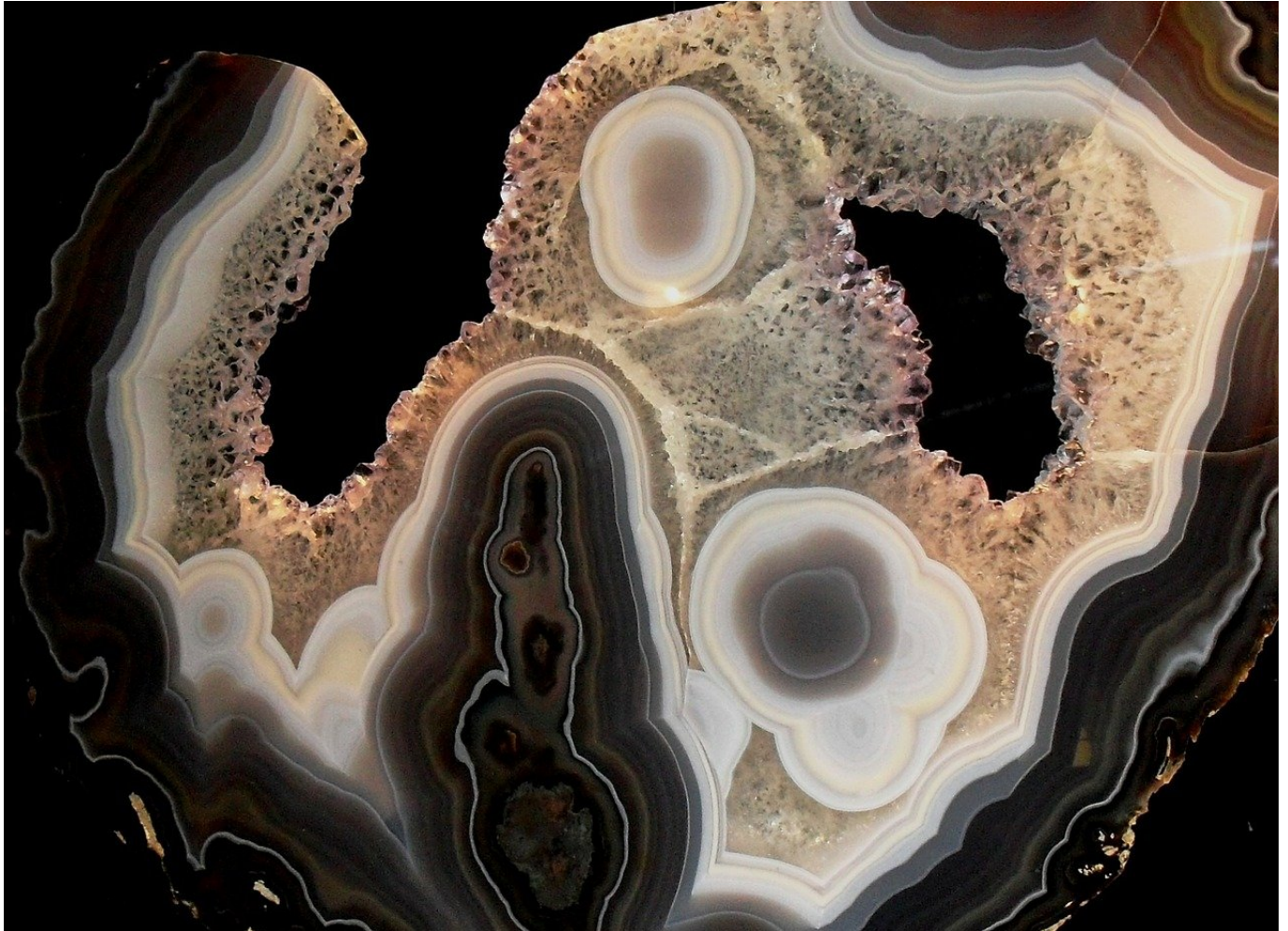
- *A sum total of many heterogenous things taken together.*
- *A rounded spherical form.*
- *A number of different things, parts or items that are grouped together; collection.*
- *The process of forming a conglomerate.*
- *An occurrence combining miscellaneous things into a (more or less) rounded mass.*



Synonyms of "Conglomeration" as a noun (13 Words)

<u>aggregate</u>	Pieces of broken or crushed stone or gravel used to make concrete and in building. <i>Use aggregate for the first layer when filling the trench.</i>
assortment	A miscellaneous collection of things or people. <i>A great assortment of cars was on display.</i>
<u>cluster</u>	A group of consonants pronounced in immediate succession, as str in strong. <i>Noble metal clusters supported on an acidic carrier.</i>
collection	A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection. <i>The collection of data.</i>

combination	A sequence of numbers or letters used to open a combination lock. <i>Combination remedies contain painkiller decongestant and cough soother.</i>
congeries	A disorderly collection; a jumble. <i>A congeries of European states.</i>
conglobation	An occurrence combining miscellaneous things into a (more or less) rounded mass.
medley	A musical composition consisting of a series of songs or other musical pieces from various sources. <i>The junior 4×50 m medley relay.</i>
miscellany	A group or collection of different items; a mixture. <i>A miscellany of houses.</i>
mix	An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>The mixing of sound channels in the recording studio.</i>
pot-pourri	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things.
selection	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>There has been more than enough time for selection to generate specific DNA sequences of the required length.</i>
variety	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>The centre offers a variety of leisure activities.</i>



Usage Examples of "Conglomeration" as a noun

- A loose conglomeration of pieces.
- The practice of media conglomeration.

accrete	Grow or become attached by accretion. <i>The gas will cool and then accrete to the galaxy's core.</i>
aggregate	Amount in the aggregate to. <i>He set the pace with a one over par aggregate of 151.</i>
armful	A large quantity. <i>A shop assistant scuttled into the changing rooms with an armful of clothes.</i>

<u>behemoth</u>	A huge or monstrous creature. <i>Shoppers are now more loyal to their local shops than to faceless behemoths.</i>
big	Larger than other items of the same kind. <i>Set out for the big city.</i>
bulky	Of large size for its weight. <i>A bulky carrier bag.</i>
colossal	(of a statue) at least twice life size. <i>Colossal crumbling ruins of an ancient temple.</i>
complex	Make an atom or compound form a complex with another. <i>A leisure complex.</i>
complexity	A factor involved in a complicated process or situation. <i>An issue of great complexity.</i>
cumbersome	Difficult to handle or use especially because of size or weight. <i>A cumbersome piece of machinery.</i>
diversity	A range of different things. <i>A diversity of possibilities.</i>
elephantine	Of, resembling, or characteristic of an elephant or elephants, especially in being large, clumsy, or awkward. <i>There was an elephantine thud from the bathroom.</i>
enormity	(in neutral use) large size or scale. <i>In careful usage the noun enormity is not used to express the idea of great size.</i>
enormous	Very large in size, quantity, or extent. <i>The possibilities are enormous.</i>
gargantuan	Enormous. <i>A gargantuan appetite.</i>
<u>gigantic</u>	Of very great size or extent; huge or enormous. <i>Gigantic disappointment.</i>
immense	Extremely large or great, especially in scale or degree. <i>Immense numbers of birds.</i>
largeness	The capacity to understand a broad range of topics. <i>The might have repercussions of unimaginable largeness.</i>
leviathan	A thing that is very large or powerful, especially an organization or vehicle. <i>It s a challenge to navigate a wheeled leviathan in rush hour traffic.</i>
mammoth	So exceedingly large or extensive as to suggest a giant or mammoth. <i>A mammoth corporation.</i>

massive	Large and heavy or solid. <i>A massive rampart of stone.</i>
oversize	Larger than normal for its kind.
oversized	Bigger than the usual size. <i>An oversized T shirt.</i>
ratio	The relative magnitudes of two quantities (usually expressed as a quotient). <i>The ratio of men's jobs to women's is 8 to 1.</i>
sized	Having a specified size. <i>Comfortably sized rooms.</i>
stature	(of a standing person) the distance from head to foot. <i>She was small in stature.</i>
stupendous	Extremely impressive. <i>Stupendous demand.</i>
titanic	Of great force or power. <i>A series of titanic explosions.</i>
tremendous	Extremely good or impressive; excellent. <i>The crew did a tremendous job.</i>
vast	An immense space. <i>The vast accumulation of knowledge which we call civilization.</i>
