alike	(of two or more people or things) similar to each other. <i>Friends are generally alike in background and taste.</i>
all of a piece	Quantifier; used with either mass or count nouns to indicate the whole number or amount of or every one of a class.
<u>comparable</u>	Conforming in every respect. <i>Nobody is comparable with this athlete.</i>

concordant	In agreement; consistent. <i>The answers were roughly concordant.</i>
congruous	Suitable or appropriate together. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i>
<u>consistent</u>	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>The parents are being consistent and firm in their reactions.</i>
consonant	Denoting or relating to a consonant. <i>The findings are consonant with other research.</i>
correlative	Having a mutual relationship; corresponding. <i>Rights whether moral or legal can involve correlative duties.</i>
corresponding	Similar especially in position or purpose. <i>A number of corresponding diagonal points.</i>
coupled	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks. <i>Coupled images.</i>
double	Used of homologous chromosomes associated in pairs in synapsis. <i>A sly double meaning.</i>
<u>duplicate</u>	Being two identical. <i>A duplicate set of keys.</i>
equivalent	Having the same or a similar effect as. <i>One unit is equivalent to one glass of wine.</i>
fitting	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>A fitting reward.</i>
<u>identical</u>	Derived from a single egg or ovum. <i>This is the identical room we stayed in before.</i>
indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>A colorless person quite indistinguishable from the colorless mass of humanity.</i>
<u>interchangeable</u>	Capable of replacing or changing places with something else; permitting mutual substitution without loss of function or suitability. <i>The arguments of the symmetric relation is a sister of are interchangeable.</i>
like	Conforming in every respect. <i>They looked utterly alike.</i>
like peas in a pod	Equal in amount or value.
like two peas in a pod	Conforming in every respect.

matching	Being two identical. <i>A blue jacket and matching skirt.</i>
paired	Occurring in pairs or as a pair. <i>Paired gloves.</i>
parallel	Being everywhere equidistant and not intersecting. <i>The road runs parallel to the Ottawa River.</i>
reconcilable	Capable of being reconciled; compatible. <i>The two propositions are hardly reconcilable.</i>
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>Problems similar to mine.</i>
twin	Of a crystal twinned. <i>The twin problems of economic failure and social disintegration.</i>

Usage Examples of "Congruent" as an adjective

- *Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely congruent.*
- *The rules may not be congruent with the requirements of the law.*

alike	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They dressed alike in black trousers and jackets.</i>
analogous	(of organs) performing a similar function but having a different evolutionary origin, such as the wings of insects and birds. <i>Salmon roe is marketed as analogous to caviar.</i>
coexisting	Existing at the same time.
coincident	Matching point for point. <i>The stake of defence attorneys is not always coincident with that of their clients.</i>
coincidental	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>Any resemblance between their reports is purely coincidental.</i>
compatibility	A state in which two things are able to exist or occur together without problems or conflict. <i>They felt the bond of true compatibility.</i>
compatible	(of two people) able to have a harmonious relationship; well suited. <i>Packages available for IBM PCs and compatibles.</i>

concurrent	(of two or more prison sentences) to be served at the same time. <i>There are three concurrent art fairs around the city.</i>
congruous	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i>
contemporaneous	Occurring in the same period of time. <i>A rise in interest rates is often contemporaneous with an increase in inflation.</i>
cooperation	Assistance, especially by complying readily with requests. <i>They worked in close cooperation with the British Tourist Authority.</i>
equal	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>On equal terms.</i>
equalize	Level the score in a match by scoring a goal. <i>Morgan equalized ten minutes into the second half.</i>
equate	Consider (one thing) to be the same as or equivalent to another. <i>The level of prices will move to equate supply and demand.</i>
equilateral	A figure whose sides are all equal. <i>An equilateral triangle.</i>
equivalent	Being essentially equal to something. <i>One unit is equivalent to one glass of wine.</i>
evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
harmonious	Forming a pleasing or consistent whole. <i>The decor is a harmonious blend of traditional and modern.</i>
identical	Coinciding exactly when superimposed. <i>Identical twins are monovular.</i>
indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>They wore indistinguishable hats.</i>
liken	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
par	The number of strokes a first class player should normally require for a particular hole or course. <i>The sixteenth is a par five.</i>
same	Similarly in the same way. <i>The village stayed the same.</i>
similar	A person or thing similar to another. <i>They wore similar coats.</i>

<u>simultaneous</u>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>Simultaneous</i> translation.
<u>sync</u>	Synchronization. <i>Images flash on to your screen in sync with the music.</i>
<u>synchronize</u>	Cause to occur or operate at the same time or rate. <i>The clocks synchronize.</i>
<u>synchronous</u>	Existing or occurring at the same time. <i>Recovery was synchronous with therapy.</i>
<u>tantamount</u>	Equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as. <i>His statement was tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i>
<u>twin</u>	A twin bedded room. <i>I thought you must have a double or be a twin.</i>
