<b>alike</b>	(of two or more people or things) similar to each other. <i>Friends are generally <b>alike</b> in background and taste.</i>
<b>all of a piece</b>	Quantifier; used with either mass or count nouns to indicate the whole number or amount of or every one of a class.
<b><u>comparable</u></b>	Conforming in every respect. <i>Nobody is <b>comparable</b> with this athlete.</i>

<b>concordant</b>	In agreement; consistent. <i>The answers were roughly <b>concordant</b>.</i>
<b>congruous</b>	Suitable or appropriate together. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>
<b><u>consistent</u></b>	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>The parents are being <b>consistent</b> and firm in their reactions.</i>
<b>consonant</b>	Denoting or relating to a consonant. <i>The findings are <b>consonant</b> with other research.</i>
<b>correlative</b>	Having a mutual relationship; corresponding. <i>Rights whether moral or legal can involve <b>correlative</b> duties.</i>
<b>corresponding</b>	Similar especially in position or purpose. <i>A number of <b>corresponding</b> diagonal points.</i>
<b>coupled</b>	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks. <i><b>Coupled</b> images.</i>
<b>double</b>	Used of homologous chromosomes associated in pairs in synapsis. <i>A sly <b>double</b> meaning.</i>
<b><u>duplicate</u></b>	Being two identical. <i>A <b>duplicate</b> set of keys.</i>
<b>equivalent</b>	Having the same or a similar effect as. <i>One unit is <b>equivalent</b> to one glass of wine.</i>
<b>fitting</b>	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>A <b>fitting</b> reward.</i>
<b><u>identical</u></b>	Derived from a single egg or ovum. <i>This is the <b>identical</b> room we stayed in before.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>A colorless person quite <b>indistinguishable</b> from the colorless mass of humanity.</i>
<b><u>interchangeable</u></b>	Capable of replacing or changing places with something else; permitting mutual substitution without loss of function or suitability. <i>The arguments of the symmetric relation is a sister of are <b>interchangeable</b>.</i>
<b>like</b>	Conforming in every respect. <i>They looked utterly <b>alike</b>.</i>
<b>like peas in a pod</b>	Equal in amount or value.
<b>like two peas in a pod</b>	Conforming in every respect.

<b>matching</b>	Being two identical. <i>A blue jacket and <b>matching</b> skirt.</i>
<b><u>paired</u></b>	Occurring in pairs or as a pair. <i><b>Paired</b> gloves.</i>
<b><u>parallel</u></b>	Being everywhere equidistant and not intersecting. <i>The road runs <b>parallel</b> to the Ottawa River.</i>
<b>reconcilable</b>	Capable of being reconciled; compatible. <i>The two propositions are hardly <b>reconcilable</b>.</i>
<b>similar</b>	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>Problems <b>similar</b> to mine.</i>
<b><u>twin</u></b>	Of a crystal twinned. <i>The <b>twin</b> problems of economic failure and social disintegration.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Congruent" as an adjective

- *Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely congruent.*
- *The rules may not be congruent with the requirements of the law.*

## Associations of "Congruent" (30 Words)

<b>alike</b>	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They dressed <b>alike</b> in black trousers and jackets.</i>
<b><u>analogous</u></b>	(of organs) performing a similar function but having a different evolutionary origin, such as the wings of insects and birds. <i>Salmon roe is marketed as <b>analogous</b> to caviar.</i>
<b>coexisting</b>	Existing at the same time.
<b>coincident</b>	Matching point for point. <i>The stake of defence attorneys is not always <b>coincident</b> with that of their clients.</i>
<b><u>coincidental</u></b>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>Any resemblance between their reports is purely <b>coincidental</b>.</i>
<b>compatibility</b>	A state in which two things are able to exist or occur together without problems or conflict. <i>They felt the bond of true <b>compatibility</b>.</i>
<b>compatible</b>	(of two people) able to have a harmonious relationship; well suited. <i>Packages available for IBM PCs and <b>compatibles</b>.</i>

<b>concurrent</b>	(of two or more prison sentences) to be served at the same time. <i>There are three <b>concurrent</b> art fairs around the city.</i>
<b>congruous</b>	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>
<b>contemporaneous</b>	Occurring in the same period of time. <i>A rise in interest rates is often <b>contemporaneous</b> with an increase in inflation.</i>
<b>cooperation</b>	Assistance, especially by complying readily with requests. <i>They worked in close <b>cooperation</b> with the British Tourist Authority.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>On <b>equal</b> terms.</i>
<b>equalize</b>	Level the score in a match by scoring a goal. <i>Morgan <b>equalized</b> ten minutes into the second half.</i>
<b>equate</b>	Consider (one thing) to be the same as or equivalent to another. <i>The level of prices will move to <b>equate</b> supply and demand.</i>
<b>equilateral</b>	A figure whose sides are all equal. <i>An <b>equilateral</b> triangle.</i>
<b>equivalent</b>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>One unit is <b>equivalent</b> to one glass of wine.</i>
<b>evenhanded</b>	Without partiality. <i><b>Evenhanded</b> justice.</i>
<b>harmonious</b>	Forming a pleasing or consistent whole. <i>The decor is a <b>harmonious</b> blend of traditional and modern.</i>
<b>identical</b>	Coinciding exactly when superimposed. <i><b>Identical</b> twins are monovular.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>They wore <b>indistinguishable</b> hats.</i>
<b>liken</b>	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>par</b>	The number of strokes a first class player should normally require for a particular hole or course. <i>The sixteenth is a <b>par</b> five.</i>
<b>same</b>	Similarly in the same way. <i>The village stayed the <b>same</b>.</i>
<b>similar</b>	A person or thing similar to another. <i>They wore <b>similar</b> coats.</i>

<b><u>simultaneous</u></b>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <b><i>Simultaneous</i></b> translation.
<b><u>sync</u></b>	Synchronization. <i>Images flash on to your screen in <b>sync</b> with the music.</i>
<b><u>synchronize</u></b>	Cause to occur or operate at the same time or rate. <i>The clocks <b>synchronize</b>.</i>
<b><u>synchronous</u></b>	Existing or occurring at the same time. <i>Recovery was <b>synchronous</b> with therapy.</i>
<b><u>tantamount</u></b>	Equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as. <i>His statement was <b>tantamount</b> to an admission of guilt.</i>
<b><u>twin</u></b>	A twin bedded room. <i>I thought you must have a double or be a <b>twin</b>.</i>
