## Conjunction as a Noun

### Definitions of "Conjunction" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “conjunction” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The grammatical relation between linguistic units (words or phrases or clauses) that are connected by a conjunction.*
- *The action or an instance of two or more events or things occurring at the same point in time or space.*
- *(astronomy) apparent meeting or passing of two or more celestial bodies in the same degree of the zodiac.*
- *Something that joins or connects.*
- *Apparent meeting or passing of two or more celestial bodies in the same degree of the zodiac.*
- *The state of being joined together.*
- *An uninflected function word that serves to conjoin words or phrases or clauses or sentences.*
- *The temporal property of two things happening at the same time.*
- *A word used to connect clauses or sentences or to coordinate words in the same clause*

(e.g. *and, but, if*).

- An alignment of two planets or other celestial objects so that they appear to be in the same, or nearly the same, place in the sky.

A linear arrangement of stones.  
*Present day road **alignments**.*

### **co-occurrence**

An event or situation that happens at the same time as or in connection with another.

### **coexistence**

Existing peacefully together.  
*What is needed today is peaceful **coexistence**.*

### [coincidence](#)

The fact of corresponding in nature or in time of occurrence.  
*The interval determining the **coincidence** gate is adjustable.*

### **colligation**

The connection of isolated facts by a general hypothesis.

### **concomitance**

The fact of existing or occurring together with something else.

<b>concurrency</b>	Acting together, as agents or circumstances or events. <i>Delays can be avoided by arriving at political <b>concurrency</b> at the start.</i>
<b>conjugation</b>	The class in which a verb is put according to the manner of this variation. <i>Immunity may be transferable by <b>conjugation</b> to other bacterial strains.</i>
<b>conjunctive</b>	A word or expression acting as a conjunction.
<b>connective</b>	An uninflected function word that serves to conjoin words or phrases or clauses or sentences. <i>She would be more likely to use a temporal <b>connective</b> such as before after or then than to use a causal <b>connective</b>.</i>
<b>contemporaneity</b>	Lack of respect accompanied by a feeling of intense dislike.
<b>contemporaneousness</b>	The quality of being current or of the present.
<b>continuative</b>	A continuative word or phrase e.g. yes well as I was saying.
<b>junction</b>	A place where two or more roads or railway lines meet. <i>The <b>junction</b> of Queen s Road and Lancaster Avenue.</i>
<b>simultaneity</b>	Happening or existing or done at the same time.
<b>simultaneousness</b>	Happening or existing or done at the same time.
<b><u>synchronicity</u></b>	The simultaneous occurrence of events which appear significantly related but have no discernible causal connection. <i>Such <b>synchronicity</b> is quite staggering.</i>
<b>synchrony</b>	Simultaneous action, development, or occurrence. <i>The drug produces an increased <b>synchrony</b> of the brain waves.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Conjunction" as a noun

- *The planet reached conjunction with the sun.*
- *A conjunction of favourable political and economic circumstances.*
- *The conjunctions and oppositions of the planets.*
- *He postulated that the Americas were formed by the conjunction of floating islands.*

<b>archaism</b>	The use or conscious imitation of archaic styles or features in language or art. <i>Mozart s use of <b>archaism</b>.</i>
<b>combined</b>	Made or joined or united into one.
<b>conjugation</b>	The variation of the form of a verb in an inflected language such as Latin, by which the voice, mood, tense, number, and person are identified. <i>It was the <b>conjugation</b> of verbs he found most difficult.</i>
<b>declarative</b>	Relating to the mood of verbs that is used simple in declarative statements. <i><b>Declarative</b> statements.</i>
<b>derivation</b>	(historical linguistics) an explanation of the historical origins of a word or phrase. <i>The <b>derivation</b> of scientific laws from observation.</i>
<b><u>derivative</u></b>	Resulting from or employing derivation. <i>Equity based <b>derivative</b> products.</i>
<b>determiner</b>	An argument that is conclusive.
<b><u>evocative</u></b>	Serving to bring to mind- Wilder Hobson. <i>The building s cramped interiors are highly <b>evocative</b> of past centuries.</i>
<b>grammatical</b>	Well formed; in accordance with the rules of the grammar of a language. <i>The <b>grammatical</b> function of a verb.</i>
<b>however</b>	By contrast; on the other hand. <i>Although I m a little afraid <b>however</b> I d like to try it.</i>
<b><u>indicative</u></b>	The indicative mood. <i><b>Indicative</b> mood.</i>
<b>inflect</b>	Of a word or language undergo inflection. <i>All of these words <b>inflect</b> irregularly.</i>
<b>locative</b>	A word in the locative case.
<b>noun</b>	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
<b>participle</b>	A word formed from a verb e g going gone being been and used as an adjective e g working woman burnt toast or a noun e g good breeding In English participles are also used to make compound verb forms e g is going has been.

<b>phrase</b>	Divide music into phrases in a particular way especially in performance. <i>His favourite <b>phrase</b> is it s a pleasure.</i>
<b><u>predicate</u></b>	One of the two main constituents of a sentence the predicate contains the verb and its complements. <i>Socrates is a man <b>predicates</b> manhood of Socrates.</i>
<b>prefix</b>	Attach a prefix to. <i><b>Prefix</b>ed words.</i>
<b>pronoun</b>	A function word that is used in place of a noun or noun phrase.
<b>revealing</b>	The speech act of making something evident. <i>A <b>revealing</b> glance.</i>
<b>suffix</b>	Append something especially as a suffix. <i><b>Suffix</b> words.</i>
<b><u>suggestive</u></b>	Tending to suggest or imply. <i><b>Suggestive</b> poses.</i>
<b>term</b>	Give a descriptive name to call by a specified term. <i>The general <b>term</b> of an algebraic equation of the <math>n</math> th degree.</i>
<b><u>utilize</u></b>	Convert (from an investment trust to a unit trust). <i>Vitamin C helps your body <b>utilize</b> the iron present in your diet.</i>
<b>verb</b>	Use a word that is not conventionally used as a verb typically a noun as a verb. <i>Any English noun can be <b>verbed</b> but some are more resistant than others.</i>
<b>word</b>	A command password or signal. <i>So many <b>words</b> for so few ideas.</i>
