Associations of "Conk out" (30 Words)

aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground nuclear testing.</i>
absentee	One that is absent or not in residence. <i>An absentee from the match.</i>
<u>away</u>	Out of the way especially away from one's thoughts. <i>The boat was 5 miles off or away.</i>
<u>barring</u>	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
<u>besides</u>	Used to introduce an additional idea or explanation. <i>I'm capable of doing the work and a lot more besides.</i>
by	In reserve; not for immediate use. <i>A car flashed by on the other side of the road.</i>
decriminalize	Stop treating (something) as illegal or as a criminal offence. <i>A battle to decriminalize cannabis.</i>
<u>depart</u>	Go away or leave. <i>They departed for Germany.</i>
<u>dispel</u>	Force to go away; used both with concrete and metaphoric meanings. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine's dejection.</i>
<u>dwelling</u>	A house, flat, or other place of residence. <i>The proposed dwelling is out of keeping with those nearby.</i>
elimination	The act of removing an unknown mathematical quantity by combining equations. <i>The elimination of extreme poverty is a key objective.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>
exclude	Remove from consideration. <i>The bad results were excluded from the report.</i>

exemption	The action of freeing or state of being free from an obligation or liability imposed on others. <i>Additional exemptions are allowed for each dependent.</i>
exhale	Give off (vapour or fumes). <i>She sat back and exhaled deeply.</i>
habitable	Suitable or good enough to live in. <i>The house should be habitable by Christmas.</i>
habitation	The fact of living in a particular place. <i>He built his habitation close to the river.</i>
hall	The principal living room of a medieval house. <i>The village hall.</i>
home	Return home accurately from a long distance. <i>A home computer.</i>
leave	Leave unchanged or undisturbed or refrain from taking. <i>We were almost the last to leave.</i>
obviate	Avoid or prevent (something undesirable). <i>A parachute can be used to obviate disaster.</i>
offstage	(in a theatre) away from the stage and so not visible to the audience. <i>Screams were heard offstage.</i>
omit	Fail or neglect to do. <i>He modestly omits to mention that he was a pole vault champion.</i>
outdoors	Any area outside buildings or shelter, typically that far away from human habitation. <i>It was warm enough to eat outdoors.</i>
outside	Outside a building. <i>The outside lane.</i>
porch	A structure attached to the exterior of a building often forming a covered entrance. <i>Daniel and Lydia sat out on the porch for many hours.</i>
redefine	Give a new or different definition to. <i>The role of the Emperor was redefined.</i>
respire	Breathe. <i>Lichens respire at lower levels of temperature and moisture.</i>
tent	A web that resembles a tent or carpet. <i>He pitched his tent near the creek.</i>
