<b>consultant</b>	An expert who gives advice. <i>A <b>consultant</b> paediatrician.</i>
<b>cuisine</b>	The practice or manner of preparing food or the food so prepared. <i>Much Venetian <b>cuisine</b> is based on seafood.</i>
<b>deft</b>	Demonstrating skill and cleverness. <i>The script was both <b>deft</b> and literate.</i>

<b>epicurean</b>	Of Epicurus or epicureanism. <i>An <b>epicurean</b> banquet.</i>
<b>expert</b>	Having or involving a great deal of knowledge or skill in a particular area. <i>An <b>expert</b> in healthcare.</i>
<b>gastronome</b>	A person devoted to refined sensuous enjoyment (especially good food and drink). <i><b>Gastronomes</b> will be fascinated by this guide to French cooking.</i>
<b>gourmet</b>	Of a kind or standard suitable for a gourmet. <i>A <b>gourmet</b> meal.</i>
<b>grammarians</b>	A linguist who specializes in the study of grammar and syntax.
<b>guru</b>	An influential teacher or popular expert. <i>A <b>guru</b> of genomics.</i>
<b>ingredient</b>	A component of a mixture or compound. <i>Mix all of the <b>ingredients</b> together.</i>
<b>luminary</b>	A celebrity who is an inspiration to others. <i>One of the <b>luminaries</b> of child psychiatry.</i>
<b>maven</b>	An expert or connoisseur. <i>Fashion <b>mavens</b> call beige oatmeal.</i>
<b>miniaturist</b>	A painter of miniatures or an illuminator of manuscripts.
<b>occupational</b>	Relating to a job or profession. <i>An <b>occupational</b> pension scheme.</i>
<b>philanthropist</b>	A person who seeks to promote the welfare of others, especially by the generous donation of money to good causes. <i>The trust was founded by an American <b>philanthropist</b>.</i>
<b>piece</b>	Repair by adding pieces. <i>A <b>piece</b> of cheese.</i>

<b>practiced</b>	Skillful after much practice. A <b>practiced</b> marksman.
<b>professionally</b>	In a professional manner. They had their hair and make up done <b>professionally</b> .
<b>retailer</b>	A person who relates the details of a story or incident to others. The big supermarkets have forced many independent <b>retailers</b> out of business.
<b>silversmith</b>	Someone who makes or repairs articles of silver.
<b>specialist</b>	A person highly trained in a particular branch of medicine. He is a <b>specialist</b> in psychometric testing.
<u><a href="#">specialize</a></u>	Adapt or set apart (an organ or part) to serve a special function or to suit a particular way of life. She <b>specializes</b> in honey bees.
<b>sybarite</b>	A person who is self-indulgent in their fondness for sensuous luxury.
<b>tanner</b>	A small coin of the United Kingdom worth six pennies; not minted since 1970. Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless <b>tanners</b> .
<u><a href="#">technical</a></u>	(in areas with guerrilla warfare) a small truck with a machine gun mounted on the back. <b>Technical</b> language.
<b>wright</b>	United States writer whose work is concerned with the oppression of African Americans (1908-1960).
