According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “conscientiously” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a way that is motivated by one's moral sense of right and wrong.*
- *In a thorough and responsible way.*
- *With extreme conscientiousness.*



Synonyms of "Conscientiously" as an adverb (2 Words)

religiously With extreme conscientiousness.
Religiously inspired art.

scrupulously With extreme conscientiousness.
The policies must be **scrupulously** observed.

- *People who are conscientiously opposed to killing.*
- *He could not conscientiously take the oath.*
- *A conscientiously detailed legislative history.*

assay	Determine the content or quality of (a metal or ore). <i>I assayed a little joke of mine on him.</i>
assiduity	Constant or close attention to what one is doing. <i>The assiduity with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
attempt	Make an effort or attempt. <i>An attempt to halt the bombings.</i>
contend	To make the subject of dispute, contention, or litigation. <i>Factions within the government were contending for the succession to the presidency.</i>
contribute	Contribute to some cause. <i>He contributed to a private pension.</i>
diligent	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>After diligent searching he found a parcel.</i>
effort	Earnest and conscientious activity intended to do or accomplish something. <i>In an effort to reduce inflation the government increased interest rates.</i>
endeavor	Earnest and conscientious activity intended to do or accomplish something. <i>Wished him luck in his endeavor.</i>
endeavour	Try hard to do or achieve something. <i>An endeavour to reduce serious injury.</i>
exertion	Physical or mental effort. <i>She was panting with the exertion.</i>
filibuster	Obstruct proposed legislation with a filibuster. <i>The bill was defeated by a Senate filibuster in June.</i>
futilely	In a futile and unproductive manner.
jimmy	To move or force, especially in an effort to get something open. <i>In Britain they call a jimmy and jemmy.</i>
overexertion	Excessive exertion; so much exertion that discomfort or injury results.
pains	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
practise	Carry out or perform (a particular activity, method, or custom) habitually or regularly. <i>I need to practise my French.</i>
pry	Inquire too closely into a person's private affairs. <i>I m sick of you prying into my personal life.</i>

reconstruction	A reconstruction of the accident would be staged to try to discover the cause of the tragedy.
render	To surrender someone or something to another. <i>The pianist rendered the Beethoven sonata beautifully.</i>
strenuous	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance. <i>The government made strenuous efforts to upgrade the quality of the teaching profession.</i>
strive	Struggle or fight vigorously. <i>We must strive to secure steady growth.</i>
striving	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
struggling	Engaged in a struggle to overcome especially poverty or obscurity. <i>A financially struggling theater.</i>
suicide	A person who commits suicide. <i>A suicide blast caused more deaths.</i>
taxing	Not easily borne; wearing. <i>A taxing schedule.</i>
tireless	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>A tireless campaigner.</i>
toil	Productive work (especially physical work done for wages). <i>Richard toiled to build his editorial team.</i>
travail	Work hard. <i>Creation may travail in pain but it cannot escape its destiny.</i>
try	An act of trying something new or different to see if it is suitable effective or pleasant. <i>She s not here but you could try her room.</i>
workmanlike	Worthy of a good workman. <i>The book is a workmanlike job with chronology and bibliography and index.</i>
