<a href="#">army</a>	The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare. <i><b>Army</b> officers.</i>
<a href="#">artillery</a>	Large but transportable armament. <i>Each corps included two regiments of field <b>artillery</b>.</i>
<a href="#">besiege</a>	Surround (a place) with armed forces in order to capture it or force its surrender. <i>The press photographers <b>besieged</b> the movie star.</i>
<a href="#">brigade</a>	Form or unite into a brigade. <i>He commanded a <b>brigade</b> of 3 000 men.</i>
<a href="#">brigadier</a>	A general officer ranking below a major general.
<a href="#">byzantine</a>	A native or inhabitant of Byzantium or of the Byzantine Empire.
<a href="#">cantonment</a>	A military garrison or camp.
<a href="#">combatant</a>	Someone who fights (or is fighting). <i>All the <b>combatant</b> armies went to war with machine guns.</i>
<a href="#">commander</a>	A commissioned naval officer who ranks above a lieutenant commander and below a captain. <i>The <b>commander</b> of a paratroop regiment.</i>
<a href="#">compulsory</a>	Involving or exercising compulsion; coercive. <i>The abuse of <b>compulsory</b> powers.</i>
<a href="#">corporal</a>	A rank of non commissioned officer in the army above lance corporal or private first class and below sergeant. <i>What seemed <b>corporal</b> melted as breath into the wind.</i>
<a href="#">corps</a>	A main subdivision of an army in the field, consisting of two or more divisions. <i>At 9 30 a m the press <b>corps</b> was handed what looked to be a routine list of orders.</i>
<a href="#">demobilize</a>	Retire from military service. <i>He was <b>demobilized</b> in February 1946.</i>
<a href="#">disarm</a>	Allay the hostility or suspicions of. <i>Her charm <b>disarmed</b> the prosecution lawyer completely.</i>
<a href="#">disarmament</a>	The reduction or withdrawal of military forces and weapons. <i>The public wanted peace and <b>disarmament</b>.</i>

<b>enlist</b>	Join the military. <i>The company <b>enlisted</b> the help of independent consultants.</i>
<b>forced</b>	Forced or compelled. <i><b>Forced</b> heartiness.</i>
<b>forcible</b>	Done by force. <i>They could only be deterred by <b>forcible</b> appeals.</i>
<b>induct</b>	Formally introduce (a member of the clergy) into possession of a benefice. <i>My master <b>inducted</b> me into the skills of magic.</i>
<b>inroad</b>	An invasion or hostile attack. <i>The <b>inroads</b> and cross border raiding of the Grahams.</i>
<b>legionary</b>	A soldier who is a member of a legion (especially the French Foreign Legion). <i>The <b>legionary</b> fortress of Isca.</i>
<b>mandatory</b>	Of or conveying a command. <i>Attendance is <b>mandatory</b>.</i>
<b>martial</b>	Relating to fighting or war. <i><b>Martial</b> law.</i>
<b>military</b>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i><b>Military</b> police.</i>
<b>militia</b>	The entire body of physically fit civilians eligible by law for military service. <i>Their troops were untrained <b>militia</b>.</i>
<b>muster</b>	A formal gathering of troops, especially for inspection, display, or exercise. <i>I finally <b>mustered</b> up the courage to call them.</i>
<b>obligatory</b>	(of a ruling) having binding force. <i>An <b>obligatory</b> contribution.</i>
<b>regiment</b>	Assign to a regiment. <i>Every aspect of their life is strictly <b>regimented</b>.</i>
<b>sergeant</b>	A rank of non commissioned officer in the army or air force above corporal and below staff sergeant.
