- Retain (a particular amino acid, nucleotide, or sequence of these) unchanged in different protein or DNA molecules.
- Protect (something, especially something of environmental or cultural importance) from harm or destruction.
- Preserve with sugar.
- Preserve (fruit) with sugar.
- Keep constant through physical or chemical reactions or evolutionary change.
- Prevent the wasteful overuse of (a resource.




