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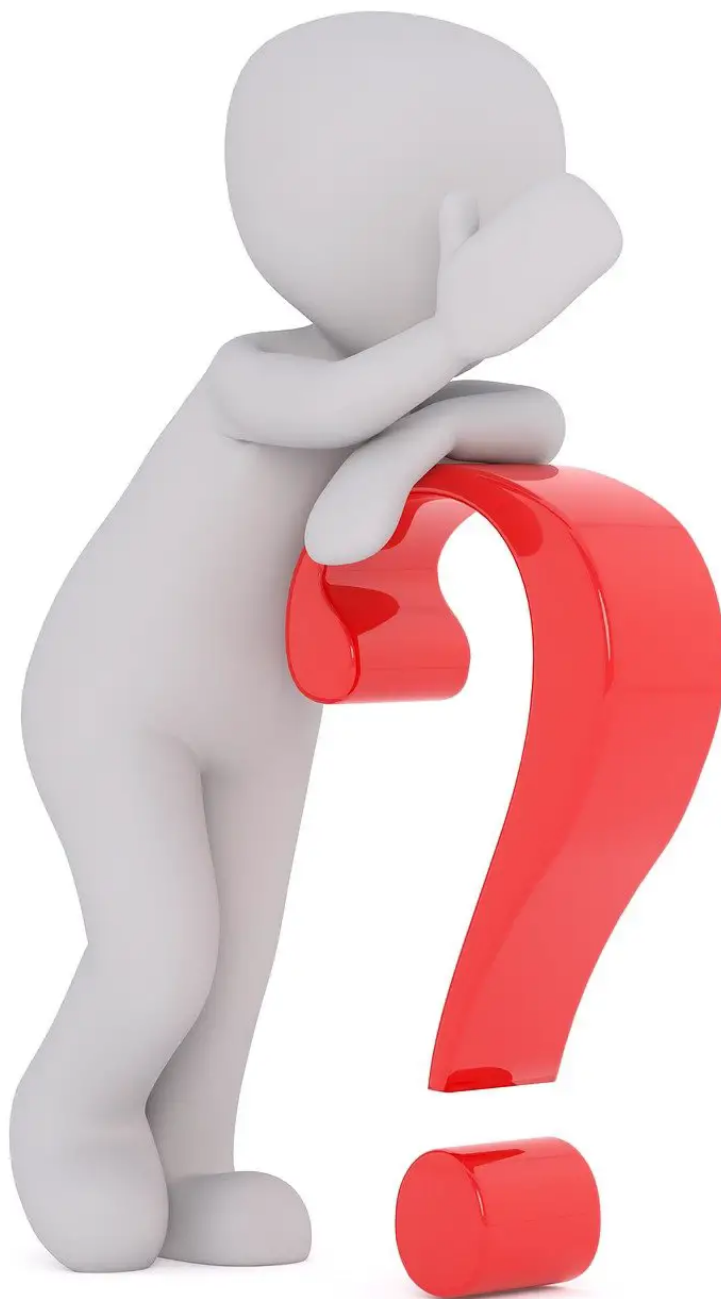

## Considerate as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Considerate" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “considerate” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Showing concern for the rights and feelings of others.*
- *Careful not to inconvenience or harm others.*
- *Showing careful thought.*



## Synonyms of "Considerate" as an adjective (11 Words)

[accommodating](#) Helpful in bringing about a harmonious adaptation.  
*We always found the our local branch most **accommodating**.*

<b><u>attentive</u></b>	(often followed by `to') giving care or attention. <i>Never before had she had such an <b>attentive</b> audience.</i>
<b>concerned</b>	Worried, troubled, or anxious. <i><b>Concerned</b> parents of youthful offenders.</i>
<b><u>cooperative</u></b>	Willing to be of assistance. <i>Every member has clearly defined tasks in a <b>cooperative</b> enterprise.</i>
<b>heedful</b>	Aware of and attentive to. <i><b>Heedful</b> of what they were doing.</i>
<b>helpful</b>	Providing assistance or serving a useful function. <i>Pages of <b>helpful</b> information.</i>
<b><u>mindful</u></b>	Focusing one's awareness on the present moment, especially as part of a therapeutic or meditative technique. <i><b>Mindful</b> of these criticisms I shall attempt to justify my action.</i>
<b>obliging</b>	Willing to do a service or kindness; helpful. <i>One of the most <b>obliging</b> stewards.</i>
<b>patient</b>	Enduring trying circumstances with even temper or characterized by such endurance. <i>A <b>patient</b> smile.</i>
<b>solicitous</b>	Full of anxiety and concern. <i>Made <b>solicitous</b> inquiries about our family.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>How very <b>thoughtful</b> of you.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Considerate" as an adjective

- *She was unfailingly kind and considerate.*
- *Be considerate over your handwriting.*



## Associations of "Considerate" (30 Words)

<b>absorbed</b>	Giving or marked by complete attention to- Walter de la Mare. <i>The stones warm slowly throughout the day then radiate <b>absorbed</b> heat at night.</i>
<b>altruistic</b>	Showing a disinterested and selfless concern for the well-being of others; unselfish. <i>It was an entirely <b>altruistic</b> act.</i>
<b><u>amiable</u></b>	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. <i>An <b>amiable</b> villain with a cocky sidelong grin.</i>
<b>beneficent</b>	Doing or producing good. <i>A <b>beneficent</b> democracy.</i>
<b>benevolent</b>	Generous in assistance to the poor. <i>He was something of a <b>benevolent</b> despot.</i>

<u>careful</u>	Exercising caution or showing care or attention. <i><b>Careful</b> about one's behavior.</i>
<u>cautious</u>	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>The plan received a <b>cautious</b> welcome.</i>
<u>contemplative</u>	A person devoted to the contemplative life. <i>She regarded me with a <b>contemplative</b> eye.</i>
<u>deliberate</u>	Fully considered; not impulsive. <i>With all <b>deliberate</b> speed.</i>
<b>disinterested</b>	Not influenced by considerations of personal advantage. <i>A banker is under an obligation to give <b>disinterested</b> advice.</i>
<b>generous</b>	Showing kindness towards others. <i>Unusually <b>generous</b> in his judgment of people.</i>
<u>gentle</u>	Make or become gentle. <i>A <b>gentle</b> sensitive man.</i>
<b>giver</b>	Person who makes a gift of property. <i>Care <b>givers</b>.</i>
<u>humane</u>	Inflicting the minimum of pain. <i>A <b>humane</b> education.</i>
<b>kind</b>	Each of the elements (bread and wine) of the Eucharist. <i>More data of this <b>kind</b> would be valuable.</i>
<u>lenient</u>	Tolerant or lenient. <i><b>Lenient</b> magistrates.</i>
<b>magnanimous</b>	Generous or forgiving, especially towards a rival or less powerful person. <i><b>Magnanimous</b> toward his enemies.</i>
<b>meditative</b>	Relating to or absorbed in meditation or considered thought. <i><b>Meditative</b> techniques.</i>
<u>meek</u>	Evidencing little spirit or courage; overly submissive or compliant. <i>She looked <b>meek</b> but had the heart of a lion.</i>
<b>merciful</b>	Showing or exercising mercy. <i>Our <b>merciful</b> king.</i>
<u>mild</u>	Humble in spirit or manner suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i>Fortunately the pain was <b>mild</b>.</i>
<u>muse</u>	The source of an artist's inspiration. <i>Yeats <b>muse</b> Maud Gonne.</i>
<b>pensive</b>	Showing pensive sadness. <i>A <b>pensive</b> mood.</i>

<b>philanthropic</b>	(of a person or organization) seeking to promote the welfare of others; generous and benevolent. <i><b>Philanthropic</b> contributions.</i>
<u><b>preoccupied</b></u>	Having or showing excessive or compulsive concern with something. <i>Got no help from his wife who was <b>preoccupied</b> with the children.</i>
<u><b>reflective</b></u>	Providing a reflection; capable of reflecting light or other radiation. <i><b>Reflective</b> clothing.</i>
<u><b>selfless</b></u>	Concerned more with the needs and wishes of others than with one's own; unselfish. <i>An act of <b>selfless</b> devotion.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>A <b>thoughtful</b> paper.</i>
<u><b>tolerant</b></u>	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. <i>These fish are quite <b>tolerant</b> as long as extremes of pH are avoided.</i>
<u><b>unselfish</b></u>	Not greedy. <i><b>Unselfish</b> devotion.</i>
