element	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i e the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>The death had all the elements of a great tabloid story.</i>
encompass	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one’s sphere or territory. <i>An act designed to encompass the death of the king.</i>
entail	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>The damage being done in England by entails.</i>
entangle	Cause to become twisted together with or caught in. <i>The child entangled the cord.</i>

factor	With numeral a sunscreen of the sun protection factor specified. <i>A number of factors determined the outcome.</i>
have	Have gained a qualification. <i>How many cars does she have.</i>
implicate	Impose, involve, or imply as a necessary accompaniment or result. <i>He implicated his government in the murders of three judges.</i>
implicit	Being without doubt or reserve. <i>Implicit trust.</i>
include	Make part of a whole or set. <i>The price includes dinner bed and breakfast.</i>
incorporate	Form a corporation. <i>Limited liability companies could only be incorporated under the 1930 Act.</i>
largely	To a great extent; on the whole; mostly. <i>He was soon arrested largely through the efforts of Tom Poole.</i>
mainly	For the most part. <i>He is mainly interested in butterflies.</i>
makeup	An event that is substituted for a previously cancelled event. <i>The two teams played a makeup one week later.</i>
mostly	In large part; mainly or chiefly. <i>The culprits are mostly but not exclusively male.</i>
normally	At right angles to a given line or surface. <i>Normally it takes three or four years to complete the training.</i>
ordinarily	Under normal conditions. <i>A person who is ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom.</i>
organize	Arrange systematically; order. <i>The soul doth organize the body.</i>
overwhelmingly	To a very great degree or with a great majority. <i>The reaction has been overwhelmingly positive.</i>
primarily	Of primary import. <i>Around 80 per cent of personal computers are used primarily for word processing.</i>
principally	For the most part; chiefly. <i>He was principally a landscape painter.</i>
redefine	Give a new or different definition to. <i>The role of the Emperor was redefined.</i>

wont

(of a person) in the habit of doing something; accustomed.
