<b>chiefly</b>	Mainly. <i>An audience consisting <b>chiefly</b> of women between the ages of 18 and 54.</i>
<b>commonly</b>	Very often; frequently. <i>A <b>commonly</b> used industrial chemical.</i>
<b>comprehensive</b>	A comprehensive school. <i>A <b>comprehensive</b> collection of photographs.</i>
<b>comprise</b>	Form or compose. <i>The country <b>comprises</b> twenty states.</i>
<b>connote</b>	(of a word) imply or suggest (an idea or feeling) in addition to the literal or primary meaning. <i>The term modern science usually <b>connotes</b> a complete openness to empirical testing.</i>
<b>constitute</b>	Create and charge with a task or function. <i>These <b>constitute</b> my entire belonging.</i>
<b>contain</b>	Contain or hold have within. <i>He must <b>contain</b> his hatred.</i>
<b>element</b>	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i e the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>The death had all the <b>elements</b> of a great tabloid story.</i>
<b>encompass</b>	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one’s sphere or territory. <i>An act designed to <b>encompass</b> the death of the king.</i>
<b>entail</b>	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>The damage being done in England by <b>entails</b>.</i>
<b>entangle</b>	Cause to become twisted together with or caught in. <i>The child <b>entangled</b> the cord.</i>

<b>factor</b>	With numeral a sunscreen of the sun protection factor specified. <i>A number of <b>factors</b> determined the outcome.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have gained a qualification. <i>How many cars does she <b>have</b>.</i>
<b>implicate</b>	Impose, involve, or imply as a necessary accompaniment or result. <i>He <b>implicated</b> his government in the murders of three judges.</i>
<b>implicit</b>	Being without doubt or reserve. <i><b>Implicit</b> trust.</i>
<b>include</b>	Make part of a whole or set. <i>The price <b>includes</b> dinner bed and breakfast.</i>
<b>incorporate</b>	Form a corporation. <i>Limited liability companies could only be <b>incorporated</b> under the 1930 Act.</i>
<b>largely</b>	To a great extent; on the whole; mostly. <i>He was soon arrested <b>largely</b> through the efforts of Tom Poole.</i>
<b>mainly</b>	For the most part. <i>He is <b>mainly</b> interested in butterflies.</i>
<b>makeup</b>	An event that is substituted for a previously cancelled event. <i>The two teams played a <b>makeup</b> one week later.</i>
<b>mostly</b>	In large part; mainly or chiefly. <i>The culprits are <b>mostly</b> but not exclusively male.</i>
<b>normally</b>	At right angles to a given line or surface. <i><b>Normally</b> it takes three or four years to complete the training.</i>
<b>ordinarily</b>	Under normal conditions. <i>A person who is <b>ordinarily</b> resident in the United Kingdom.</i>
<b>organize</b>	Arrange systematically; order. <i>The soul doth <b>organize</b> the body.</i>
<b>overwhelmingly</b>	To a very great degree or with a great majority. <i>The reaction has been <b>overwhelmingly</b> positive.</i>
<b>primarily</b>	Of primary import. <i>Around 80 per cent of personal computers are used <b>primarily</b> for word processing.</i>
<b>principally</b>	For the most part; chiefly. <i>He was <b>principally</b> a landscape painter.</i>
<b>redefine</b>	Give a new or different definition to. <i>The role of the Emperor was <b>redefined</b>.</i>

**wont**

(of a person) in the habit of doing something; accustomed.
