
## Consistent as an Adjective

- Marked by an orderly, logical, and aesthetically consistent relation of parts.
- The same throughout in structure or composition.
- (sometimes followed by `with') in agreement or consistent or reliable.
- In agreement or consistent or reliable.
- Compatible or in agreement with something.








### Usage Examples of "Consistent" as an adjective
