### Definitions of "Consistent" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “consistent” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Acting or done in the same way over time, especially so as to be fair or accurate.*
- *Capable of being reproduced.*
- *Unchanging in nature, standard, or effect over time.*
- *(of an argument or set of ideas) not containing any logical contradictions.*
- *Marked by an orderly, logical, and aesthetically consistent relation of parts.*
- *The same throughout in structure or composition.*
- *(sometimes followed by `with') in agreement or consistent or reliable.*
- *In agreement or consistent or reliable.*
- *Compatible or in agreement with something.*



## Synonyms of "Consistent" as an adjective (34 Words)

<b>accordant</b>	Being in agreement or harmony; often followed by `with. <i>I found the music <b>accordant</b> with the words of the service.</i>
<b>cogent</b>	Powerfully persuasive. <i>They put forward <b>cogent</b> arguments for British membership.</i>
<b><u>coherent</u></b>	Sticking together. <i>She was more <b>coherent</b> than she had been just after the accident.</i>
<b>compatible</b>	Capable of being used with or connected to other devices or components without modification. <i>Her deeds were <b>compatible</b> with her ideology.</i>
<b>congruous</b>	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>

<b>consonant</b>	Denoting or relating to a consonant. <i>A <b>consonant</b> phoneme.</i>
<b>constant</b>	Occurring continuously over a period of time. <i>A <b>constant</b> lover.</i>
<b>even</b>	Being level or straight or regular and without variation as e g in shape or texture or being in the same plane or at the same height as something else i e even with. <i>She was known to have an <b>even</b> temper and to be difficult to rile.</i>
<b>harmonious</b>	Free from disagreement or dissent. <i>The tailored clothes were <b>harmonious</b> with her military bearing.</i>
<b>homogeneous</b>	All of the same or similar kind or nature. <i><b>Homogeneous</b> catalysis.</i>
<b>in harmony</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in line</b>	Holding office.
<b>in tune</b>	Holding office.
<b>logical</b>	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>Her <b>logical</b> mind.</i>
<b>ordered</b>	Disposed or placed in a particular kind of order. <i>An <b>ordered</b> sequence.</i>
<b>orderly</b>	(of a person or group) well behaved. <i>An <b>orderly</b> arrangement of objects.</i>
<b>rational</b>	Consistent with or based on or using reason. <i><b>Rational</b> thought.</i>
<b>reasoned</b>	Based on logic or good sense. <i>A <b>reasoned</b> judgement.</i>
<b>reconcilable</b>	Capable of being reconciled. <i>The theory was quite <b>reconcilable</b> with industrialization.</i>
<b>regular</b>	Relating to a person who does something regularly. <i>The <b>regular</b> army.</i>
<b>reproducible</b>	Capable of being reproduced. <i>Astonishingly <b>reproducible</b> results can be obtained.</i>
<b>sound</b>	In good condition; free from defect or damage or decay. <i><b>Sound</b> advice.</i>
<b>stable</b>	Firm and dependable; subject to little fluctuation. <i>The officer concerned is mentally and emotionally <b>stable</b>.</i>

<b><u>steady</u></b>	(of a person) sensible, reliable, and self-restrained. <i>I thought I d better get a <b>steady</b> job.</i>
<b><u>unchanging</u></b>	Not changing; remaining the same. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
<b>undeviating</b>	Showing no deviation; constant and steady. <i>The <b>undeviating</b> loyalty of his wife.</i>
<b>unfluctuating</b>	Not liable to fluctuate or especially to fall.
<b><u>uniform</u></b>	Denoting a garment forming part of a person s uniform. <i>Black <b>uniform</b> jackets.</i>
<b>unswerving</b>	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. <i>A straight and narrow tree lined road <b>unswerving</b> across the lowlands.</i>
<b>unvarying</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i>Principles of <b>unvarying</b> validity.</i>
<b><u>unwavering</u></b>	Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss. <i>She fixed him with an <b>unwavering</b> stare.</i>
<b><u>valid</u></b>	Well grounded in logic or truth or having legal force. <i>The visas are <b>valid</b> for thirty days.</i>
<b>well reasoned</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
<b>well thought out</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

Remaining the same.

### coherent

(of a person) able to speak clearly and logically.  
*Two **coherent** sheets.*

### confirmed

(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways.  
*A **confirmed** teetotaller.*

### constant

A number representing a quantity assumed to have a fixed value in a specified mathematical context.  
*A **constant** lover.*

<b>constantly</b>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>The world is <b>constantly</b> changing.</i>
<u><b>continual</b></u>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>Some patients need <b>continual</b> safeguarding.</i>
<u><b>continually</b></u>	Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. <i>This information is <b>continually</b> updated.</i>
<b>continued</b>	Without stop or interruption. <i>To insure the <b>continued</b> success of the war.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i><b>Endless</b> ocean wastes.</i>
<b>equable</b>	Not easily irritated. <i>He could look sterner than his <b>equable</b> temperament would suggest.</i>
<b>immutable</b>	Unchanging over time or unable to be changed. <i>The view of that time was that all species were <b>immutable</b> created by God.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>indestructible</b>	Not able to be destroyed. <i><b>Indestructible</b> plastic containers.</i>
<b>invariable</b>	(of a noun in an inflected language) having the same form in both the singular and the plural, as does <i>relais</i> in French. <i>An <b>invariable</b> rule.</i>
<b>invariant</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i>The pattern of cell divisions was found to be <b>invariant</b>.</i>
<u><b>lasting</b></u>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long <b>lasting</b> friendship.</i>
<u><b>nonstop</b></u>	A flight made without intermediate stops between source and destination. <i>A <b>nonstop</b> flight to Atlanta.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>He grows <b>perpetual</b> flowering carnations.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Continuing to exist or occur over a prolonged period. <i>One of the government's most <b>persistent</b> critics.</i>
<u><b>relentless</b></u>	Never-ceasing. <i>The <b>relentless</b> beat of the drums.</i>

Shelter in a stable.

The officer concerned is mentally and emotionally **stable**.

**steadily**

At a steady rate or pace.

The mountain got **steadily** steeper.

**steady**

Make steady.

A **steady** increase.

**sustained**

Continuing for an extended period or without interruption.

**Sustained** flight.

**unceasing**

Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

Man's **unceasing** warfare with drought and isolation.

**unchangeable**

Not changeable or subject to change-Ashley Montagu.

A fixed and **unchangeable** part of the germ plasm.

**unchanging**

Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time.

The party stood for **unchanging** principles.

**unrelenting**

Never-ceasing.

The heat was **unrelenting**.
