encompass	Include comprehensively. <i>An act designed to encompass the death of the king.</i>
entail	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>The damage being done in England by entails.</i>
entangle	Entrap. <i>They were suspicious of becoming entangled in a civil war.</i>

have	Have left. <i>The only girl who would have him was the miller s daughter.</i>
<u>implicate</u>	Bear some of the responsibility for (an action or process, especially a criminal or harmful one). <i>Viruses are known to be implicated in the development of certain cancers.</i>
<u>implicit</u>	Implied though not directly expressed; inherent in the nature of something. <i>The values implicit in the school ethos.</i>
include	Have as a part, be made up out of. <i>There were doubts as to whether she was included in the invitation.</i>
incorporate	Unite or merge with something already in existence. <i>Incorporate this document with those pertaining to the same case.</i>
<u>largely</u>	On a large scale. <i>He was soon arrested largely through the efforts of Tom Poole.</i>
<u>mainly</u>	More than anything else. <i>He is mainly concerned with fiction.</i>
makeup	An event that is substituted for a previously cancelled event. <i>The two teams played a makeup one week later.</i>
<u>mostly</u>	Usually; as a rule. <i>The culprits are mostly but not exclusively male.</i>
<u>normally</u>	Under normal conditions. <i>Normally it takes three or four years to complete the training.</i>
ordinarily	Under normal conditions. <i>An effort to behave ordinarily.</i>
<u>organize</u>	Arrange by systematic planning and united effort. <i>The soul doth organize the body.</i>
<u>overwhelmingly</u>	Incapable of being resisted. <i>The candy looked overwhelmingly desirable to the dieting man.</i>
<u>primarily</u>	For the most part; mainly. <i>This is primarily a question of economics.</i>
principally	For the most part; chiefly. <i>He was principally a landscape painter.</i>
<u>redefine</u>	Give a new or different definition to. <i>The role of the Emperor was redefined.</i>

wont

An established custom.
