<b>comprise</b>	Include or contain; have as a component. <i>Documents are <b>comprised</b> of words.</i>
<b>connote</b>	(of a fact) imply as a consequence or condition. <i>The term modern science usually <b>connotes</b> a complete openness to empirical testing.</i>
<b>constitute</b>	To compose or represent. <i>His failure to act <b>constituted</b> a breach of duty.</i>
<b>contain</b>	Be capable of holding or containing. <i>Since <b>F contains</b> the factor Q it disappears from both sides of the equation.</i>
<b>element</b>	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i e the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>In your <b>element</b>.</i>
<b>encompass</b>	Include comprehensively. <i>An act designed to <b>encompass</b> the death of the king.</i>
<b>entail</b>	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>The damage being done in England by <b>entails</b>.</i>
<b>entangle</b>	Entrap. <i>They were suspicious of becoming <b>entangled</b> in a civil war.</i>

<b><u>factor</u></b>	With numeral a sunscreen of the sun protection factor specified. <i>She worked fast conscious of the time <b>factor</b>.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have left. <i>The only girl who would <b>have</b> him was the miller s daughter.</i>
<b><u>implicate</u></b>	Bear some of the responsibility for (an action or process, especially a criminal or harmful one). <i>Viruses are known to be <b>implicated</b> in the development of certain cancers.</i>
<b><u>implicit</u></b>	Implied though not directly expressed; inherent in the nature of something. <i>The values <b>implicit</b> in the school ethos.</i>
<b>include</b>	Have as a part, be made up out of. <i>There were doubts as to whether she was <b>included</b> in the invitation.</i>
<b>incorporate</b>	Unite or merge with something already in existence. <i><b>Incorporate</b> this document with those pertaining to the same case.</i>
<b><u>largely</u></b>	On a large scale. <i>He was soon arrested <b>largely</b> through the efforts of Tom Poole.</i>
<b><u>mainly</u></b>	More than anything else. <i>He is <b>mainly</b> concerned with fiction.</i>
<b>makeup</b>	An event that is substituted for a previously cancelled event. <i>The two teams played a <b>makeup</b> one week later.</i>
<b><u>mostly</u></b>	Usually; as a rule. <i>The culprits are <b>mostly</b> but not exclusively male.</i>
<b><u>normally</u></b>	Under normal conditions. <i><b>Normally</b> it takes three or four years to complete the training.</i>
<b>ordinarily</b>	Under normal conditions. <i>An effort to behave <b>ordinarily</b>.</i>
<b><u>organize</u></b>	Arrange by systematic planning and united effort. <i>The soul doth <b>organize</b> the body.</i>
<b><u>overwhelmingly</u></b>	Incapable of being resisted. <i>The candy looked <b>overwhelmingly</b> desirable to the dieting man.</i>
<b><u>primarily</u></b>	For the most part; mainly. <i>This is <b>primarily</b> a question of economics.</i>
<b>principally</b>	For the most part; chiefly. <i>He was <b>principally</b> a landscape painter.</i>
<b><u>redefine</u></b>	Give a new or different definition to. <i>The role of the Emperor was <b>redefined</b>.</i>
