## **Consolation as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Consolation" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “consolation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The act of consoling; giving relief in affliction.*
- *The comfort received by a person after a loss or disappointment.*
- *The comfort you feel when consoled in times of disappointment.*
- *A person or thing providing consolation.*
- *(in sport) a goal scored at a point when it is no longer possible for the scoring team to win.*



### Synonyms of "Consolation" as a noun (3 Words)

**comfort** A freedom from financial difficulty that promotes a comfortable state.  
*A few words of **comfort**.*

**solace** Comfort in disappointment or misery.  
*She sought **solace** in her religion.*

**solacement** The comfort you feel when consoled in times of disappointment.



## Usage Examples of "Consolation" as a noun

- *Second place was no consolation to him.*
- *The Church was the main consolation in a short and hard life.*
- *His presence was a consolation to her.*
- *Two minutes from time Moore grabbed a consolation goal for the losers.*
- *There was consolation in knowing that others were worse off.*

<b>accommodation</b>	A room, group of rooms, or building in which someone may live or stay. <i>They were living in temporary <b>accommodation</b>.</i>
<b>allay</b>	Diminish or put at rest (fear, suspicion, or worry). <i>The report attempted to educate the public and <b>allay</b> fears.</i>
<b>antispasmodic</b>	An antispasmodic drug.
<b>appease</b>	Make peace with. <i>We give to charity because it <b>appeases</b> our guilt.</i>
<b>assistance</b>	The activity of contributing to the fulfillment of a need or furtherance of an effort or purpose. <i>Schemes offering financial <b>assistance</b> to employers.</i>
<b>assuage</b>	Cause to be more favorably inclined; gain the good will of. <i>The letter <b>assuaged</b> the fears of most members.</i>
<b>cabinet</b>	A small private room. <i>A cocktail <b>cabinet</b>.</i>
<b>caress</b>	Touch or stroke gently or lovingly. <i>She <b>caressed</b> the girl's forehead.</i>
<b>comfort</b>	Lessen pain or discomfort alleviate. <i>It gave <b>comfort</b> to the enemy.</i>
<b>domestic</b>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i><b>Domestic</b> chores.</i>
<b>domesticity</b>	Domestic activities or life. <i>The atmosphere is one of happy <b>domesticity</b>.</i>
<b>encouragement</b>	The act of giving hope or support to someone. <i>Thank you for all your support and <b>encouragement</b>.</i>
<b>ergonomic</b>	Of or relating to ergonomics. <i>The <b>ergonomic</b> hazards of computer use.</i>
<b>family</b>	A principal taxonomic category that ranks above genus and below order, usually ending in -idae (in zoology) or -aceae (in botany). <i>He wanted to have a good job before starting a <b>family</b>.</i>
<b>home</b>	Provide an animal with a home as a pet. <i>He grew up in a good Christian <b>home</b>.</i>
<b>housing</b>	Structures collectively in which people are housed. <i>A <b>housing</b> development.</i>
<b>inland</b>	In or towards the interior of a country. <i>The <b>inland</b> port of Gloucester.</i>

<b>lightweight</b>	A lightweight boxer or other competitor. <b>Lightweight</b> wood.
<b>mollify</b>	Reduce the severity of (something). <i>The women hoped to <b>mollify</b> the harsh wilderness environment.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Of or relating to the government of a municipality J L kuntz. <i>National and <b>municipal</b> elections.</i>
<b>pacify</b>	Cause to be more favorably inclined; gain the good will of. <i>The U N troops are working to <b>pacify</b> Bosnia.</i>
<b>paregoric</b>	Medicine used to treat diarrhea.
<b>placate</b>	Make (someone) less angry or hostile. <i>They attempted to <b>placate</b> the students with promises.</i>
<b>portable</b>	A small transportable building used as a classroom. <b>Portable</b> versions of IBM s Systems Network Architecture technology.
<b>quell</b>	Suppress or crush completely. <b>Quell</b> my hunger.
<b>relaxation</b>	The restoration of equilibrium following disturbance. <i>I guided my patient into a state of hypnotic <b>relaxation</b>.</i>
<b>relieve</b>	Relieve oneself of troubling information. <i>The bird s body is black <b>relieved</b> only by white under the tail.</i>
<b>sheltered</b>	(of a place) protected from bad weather. <i>The plants need a shady <b>sheltered</b> spot in the garden.</i>
<b>solace</b>	Give moral or emotional strength to. <i>She sought <b>solace</b> in her religion.</i>
<b>soothe</b>	Give moral or emotional strength to. <i>The medicine <b>soothes</b> the pain of the inflammation.</i>
