Consolation as a Noun

Definitions of "Consolation" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “consolation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The act of consoling; giving relief in affliction.*
- *The comfort received by a person after a loss or disappointment.*
- *The comfort you feel when consoled in times of disappointment.*
- *A person or thing providing consolation.*
- *(in sport) a goal scored at a point when it is no longer possible for the scoring team to win.*



Synonyms of "Consolation" as a noun (3 Words)

comfort A freedom from financial difficulty that promotes a comfortable state.
*A few words of **comfort**.*

solace Comfort in disappointment or misery.
*She sought **solace** in her religion.*

solacement The comfort you feel when consoled in times of disappointment.



Usage Examples of "Consolation" as a noun

- *Second place was no consolation to him.*
- *The Church was the main consolation in a short and hard life.*
- *His presence was a consolation to her.*
- *Two minutes from time Moore grabbed a consolation goal for the losers.*
- *There was consolation in knowing that others were worse off.*

allay	Diminish or put at rest (fear, suspicion, or worry). <i>The report attempted to educate the public and allay fears.</i>
antispasmodic	An antispasmodic drug.
appease	Make peace with. <i>We give to charity because it appeases our guilt.</i>
assistance	The activity of contributing to the fulfillment of a need or furtherance of an effort or purpose. <i>Schemes offering financial assistance to employers.</i>
assuage	Cause to be more favorably inclined; gain the good will of. <i>The letter assuaged the fears of most members.</i>
cabinet	A small private room. <i>A cocktail cabinet.</i>
caress	Touch or stroke gently or lovingly. <i>She caressed the girl's forehead.</i>
comfort	Lessen pain or discomfort alleviate. <i>It gave comfort to the enemy.</i>
domestic	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>Domestic chores.</i>
domesticity	Domestic activities or life. <i>The atmosphere is one of happy domesticity.</i>
encouragement	The act of giving hope or support to someone. <i>Thank you for all your support and encouragement.</i>
ergonomic	Of or relating to ergonomics. <i>The ergonomic hazards of computer use.</i>
family	A principal taxonomic category that ranks above genus and below order, usually ending in -idae (in zoology) or -aceae (in botany). <i>He wanted to have a good job before starting a family.</i>
home	Provide an animal with a home as a pet. <i>He grew up in a good Christian home.</i>
housing	Structures collectively in which people are housed. <i>A housing development.</i>
inland	In or towards the interior of a country. <i>The inland port of Gloucester.</i>

lightweight	A lightweight boxer or other competitor. Lightweight wood.
mollify	Reduce the severity of (something). <i>The women hoped to mollify the harsh wilderness environment.</i>
municipal	Of or relating to the government of a municipality J L kuntz. <i>National and municipal elections.</i>
pacify	Cause to be more favorably inclined; gain the good will of. <i>The U N troops are working to pacify Bosnia.</i>
paregoric	Medicine used to treat diarrhea.
placate	Make (someone) less angry or hostile. <i>They attempted to placate the students with promises.</i>
portable	A small transportable building used as a classroom. Portable versions of IBM s Systems Network Architecture technology.
quell	Suppress or crush completely. Quell my hunger.
relaxation	The restoration of equilibrium following disturbance. <i>I guided my patient into a state of hypnotic relaxation.</i>
relieve	Relieve oneself of troubling information. <i>The bird s body is black relieved only by white under the tail.</i>
sheltered	(of a place) protected from bad weather. <i>The plants need a shady sheltered spot in the garden.</i>
solace	Give moral or emotional strength to. <i>She sought solace in her religion.</i>
soothe	Give moral or emotional strength to. <i>The medicine soothes the pain of the inflammation.</i>
