### Definitions of "Consolidate" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “consolidate” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Combine (a number of things) into a single more effective or coherent whole.*
- *Combine (separate pieces of legislation) into a single legislative act.*
- *Form into a solid mass or whole.*
- *Combine (a number of financial accounts or funds) into a single overall account or set of accounts.*
- *Make firm or secure; strengthen.*
- *Bring together into a single whole or system.*
- *Unite into one.*
- *Make (something) physically stronger or more solid.*
- *Make or form into a solid or hardened mass.*
- *Strengthen (one's position or power).*

<b><u>fortify</u></b>	Add spirits to (wine) to make port, sherry, or a similar drink. <i>Most commercial brands of almond milk are fortified with vitamins A, D, B2, B12, calcium, and zinc.</i>
<b><u>fuse</u></b>	Equip with a fuse provide with a fuse. <i>When fired in a special kiln the metals <b>fused</b> on to the pot.</i>
<b><u>harden</u></b>	Cause to accept or become hardened to habituate. <i>Wait for the glue to <b>harden</b>.</i>
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>Cities efforts to <b>integrate</b>.</i>
<b>make secure</b>	Act in a certain way so as to acquire.
<b>make stable</b>	Cause to do; cause to act in a specified manner.
<b>make stronger</b>	Appear to begin an activity.
<b>marry</b>	Join in marriage. <i>They had no plans to <b>marry</b>.</i>
<b><u>merge</u></b>	Combine or cause to combine to form a single entity. <i>We <b>merged</b> our resources.</i>
<b><u>mingle</u></b>	Move among and engage with others at a social function. <i>Resourcefully he <b>mingled</b> music and dance.</i>
<b><u>reinforce</u></b>	Strengthen (a military force) with additional personnel or equipment. <i>Let s <b>reinforce</b> good behavior.</i>
<b><u>secure</u></b>	Seek to guarantee repayment of (a loan) by having a right to take possession of an asset in the event of non-payment. <i>The government is concerned to <b>secure</b> the economy against too much foreign ownership.</i>
<b><u>stabilize</u></b>	Become stable or more stable. <i>His condition appears to have <b>stabilized</b>.</i>
<b>stiffen</b>	Severely restrict in scope or extent. <i>Outrage over the murders <b>stiffened</b> the government s resolve to confront the Mafia.</i>
<b>strengthen</b>	Make strong or stronger. <i><b>Strengthen</b> the relations between the two countries.</i>
<b>synthesize</b>	Make (something) by synthesis, especially chemically. <i>Pupils should <b>synthesize</b> the data they have gathered.</i>
<b>tighten</b>	Make or become tight or tighter. <i>He <b>tightened</b> up the clips.</i>
<b>unite</b>	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>His work <b>unites</b> theory and practice.</i>

<b>concerted</b>	Jointly arranged or carried out; coordinated. <i>You must make a <b>concerted</b> effort to curb this.</i>
<b>confederacy</b>	A union of political organizations. <i>The Yakuza is a secret <b>confederacy</b> of criminal fraternities.</i>
<b>consolidation</b>	The action or process of combining a number of things into a single more effective or coherent whole. <i>A <b>consolidation</b> of two corporations.</i>
<b>converge</b>	(of lines) tend to meet at a point. <i>The lines <b>converge</b> at this point.</i>
<b>federate</b>	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>In 1901 the six colonies <b>federated</b> to form the Commonwealth of Australia.</i>
<b>incorporation</b>	Learning (of values or attitudes etc.) that is incorporated within yourself. <i>A law allowing <b>incorporation</b> as a company.</i>
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>Transport planning should be <b>integrated</b> with energy policy.</i>
<b>integration</b>	The action of incorporating a racial or religious group into a community. <i><b>Integration</b> is the best hope for both black and white Americans.</i>
<b><u>meld</u></b>	A thing formed by melding a combination. <i>A <b>meld</b> of many contributions.</i>
<b><u>merge</u></b>	Become one. <i>He agreed to <b>merge</b> his broadcasting company with a multinational concern.</i>
<b>reunify</b>	Unify again, as of a country. <i>Will Korea <b>reunify</b>.</i>
<b><u>solidify</u></b>	Make solid or more solid cause to solidify. <i>Social and political pressures helped to <b>solidify</b> national identities.</i>
<b><u>syndicate</u></b>	Sell a horse to a syndicate. <i>Large scale buyouts involving a <b>syndicate</b> of financial institutions.</i>
<b>synthesis</b>	The process of making compound and derivative words. <i>The <b>synthesis</b> of intellect and emotion in his work.</i>

Bring together for a common purpose or action or ideology or in a shared situation.

*The government hoped to centralize and **unify** the nation.*

**union**

A device on a national flag emblematic of the union of two or more sovereignties typically in the upper inner corner.

*The **union** movement.*

**unite**

Be or become joined or united or linked.

*She **unites** charm with a good business sense.*

**united**

Of or relating to two people who are married to each other.

*Presented a **united** front.*

**weld**

A welded joint.

*The truck had spikes **welded** to the back.*
