<b>alliance</b>	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. <i>Divisions within the <b>alliance</b>.</i>
<b>amalgamation</b>	The action, process, or result of combining or uniting. <i>The threat of <b>amalgamation</b> with another college.</i>
<a href="#">coalition</a>	The union of diverse things into one body or form or group; the growing together of parts. <i>A <b>coalition</b> between Liberals and Conservatives.</i>
<b>confederacy</b>	A union of political organizations. <i>The Yakuza is a secret <b>confederacy</b> of criminal fraternities.</i>

<b><u>confederation</u></b>	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. A <b>confederation</b> of trade unions.
<b>conglomerate</b>	A thing consisting of a number of different and distinct parts or items that are grouped together. <i>The sediments vary from coarse <b>conglomerate</b> to fine silt and clay.</i>
<b><u>cooperative</u></b>	A farm, business, or other organization which is owned and run jointly by its members, who share the profits or benefits. <i>We run the agency as a workers <b>cooperative</b>.</i>
<b>corporation</b>	A business firm whose articles of incorporation have been approved in some state. <i>Multinational <b>corporations</b>.</i>
<b><u>federation</u></b>	The action of forming states or organizations into a single group with centralized control. <i>A first step in the <b>federation</b> of Europe.</i>
<b><u>guild</u></b>	A group of species that have similar requirements and play a similar role within a community.
<b><u>league</u></b>	The contest for the championship of a league. <i>The leading goalscorer in the <b>league</b>.</i>
<b>merger</b>	A combination of two things, especially companies, into one. <i><b>Merger</b> can be applied for when the freehold and leasehold estates become vested in the same person.</i>
<b>partnership</b>	A business or firm owned and run by two or more partners. <i>We should go on working together in <b>partnership</b>.</i>
<b><u>pool</u></b>	Any of various games played on a pool table having 6 pockets. <i>Everyone contributed to the <b>pool</b>.</i>
<b><u>syndicate</u></b>	A news agency that sells features or articles or photographs etc. to newspapers for simultaneous publication. <i>A crime <b>syndicate</b>.</i>
<b><u>union</u></b>	A part of a flag with an emblem symbolizing national union typically occupying the upper corner next to the staff. <i>Lightning produced an unusual <b>union</b> of the metals.</i>

## Associations of "Consortium" (30 Words)

<b>agreement</b>	Compatibility of observations. <i><b>Agreement</b> between experimental observations and theory.</i>
<b>alliance</b>	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. <i>The shifting <b>alliances</b> within a large family.</i>
<b>association</b>	(ecology) a group of organisms (plants and animals) that live together in a certain geographical region and constitute a community with a few dominant species. <i>Flints were found in <b>association</b> with the prehistoric remains of the bear.</i>
<b>brainstorming</b>	Group discussion to produce ideas or solve problems. <i><b>Brainstorming</b> can generate some wonderful ideas.</i>
<u><b>brotherhood</b></u>	People engaged in a particular occupation. <i>The bonds of <b>brotherhood</b>.</i>
<b>collaboration</b>	Something produced in collaboration with someone. <i>They worked either in <b>collaboration</b> or independently.</i>
<u><b>communal</b></u>	Involving the sharing of work and property. <i>Violent <b>communal</b> riots.</i>
<u><b>confederation</b></u>	The act of forming an alliance or confederation. <i>A <b>confederation</b> of trade unions.</i>
<u><b>consolidate</b></u>	Combine (a number of financial accounts or funds) into a single overall account or set of accounts. <i>The mud had <b>consolidated</b> overnight.</i>
<b>cooperation</b>	Assistance, especially by complying readily with requests. <i>Economic <b>cooperation</b>.</i>
<u><b>federation</b></u>	A group of states with a central government but independence in internal affairs. <i>A first step in the <b>federation</b> of Europe.</i>
<u><b>global</b></u>	Relating to the whole world; worldwide. <i>Give students a <b>global</b> picture of what is involved in the task.</i>
<b>globalize</b>	Make world-wide in scope or application. <i>Markets are being increasingly <b>globalized</b>.</i>
<u><b>immigration</b></u>	The place at an airport or country's border where government officials check the documents of people entering that country. <i>A barrier to control illegal <b>immigration</b> from Mexico.</i>
<u><b>international</b></u>	Any of several international socialist organizations. <i>Large <b>international</b> hotels.</i>

<b>league</b>	The contest for the championship of a league. <i>Austin s in a <b>league</b> of his own.</i>
<b>oneness</b>	The state of being in harmony with someone or something. <i>The <b>oneness</b> of all suffering people.</i>
<b>reconcilable</b>	Capable of being reconciled; compatible. <i>The theory was quite <b>reconcilable</b> with industrialization.</i>
<b>society</b>	A specified section of society. <i>The analogy between insect <b>society</b> and human city is not new.</i>
<b>syndicate</b>	Control or manage by a syndicate. <i>A crime <b>syndicate</b>.</i>
<b>together</b>	Self-confident, level-headed, or well organized. <i>She s really <b>together</b>.</i>
<b>transnational</b>	Extending or operating across national boundaries. <i><b>Transnational</b> terrorist networks.</i>
<b>unification</b>	The state of being joined or united or linked. <i>There were conversations about <b>unification</b> between the Church of England and the Methodist Church.</i>
<b>union</b>	A trade union. <i>You have to join the <b>union</b> in order to get a job.</i>
<b>united</b>	Of or relating to two people who are married to each other. <i>Presented a <b>united</b> front.</i>
<b>unity</b>	Each of the three dramatic principles requiring limitation of the supposed time of a drama to that occupied in acting it or to a single day unity of time use of one scene throughout unity of place and concentration on the development of a single plot unity of action. <i>The slope of each dotted line is less than <b>unity</b>.</i>
<b>universal</b>	A thing having universal effect currency or application. <i><b>Universal</b> experience.</i>
<b>voting</b>	A choice that is made by counting the number of people in favor of each alternative.
<b>world</b>	Human and social interaction. <i>All the <b>world</b> loves a lover.</i>
<b>worldwide</b>	Of worldwide scope or applicability Christopher Morley. <i><b>Worldwide</b> sales of television rights.</i>
