Definitions of "Conspicuous" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “conspicuous” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Clearly visible.*
- *Attracting notice or attention.*
- *Obvious to the eye or mind.*
- *Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious.*



Synonyms of "Conspicuous" as an adjective (17 Words)

- apparent** Appearing as such but not necessarily so.
*The committee investigated some **apparent** discrepancies.*
- blatant** Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry.
*A **blatant** appeal to vanity.*
- blazing** Very hot.
*The delicious cool of marble corridors after the **blazing** heat outside.*
- clear** Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible.
***Clear** and precise directions.*
- detectable** Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible.
*The virus is not yet **detectable** in the blood.*
- discernible** Perceptible by the senses or intellect.
*The newspaper reports no **discernible** progress in the negotiations.*

evident	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>She ate the biscuits with evident enjoyment.</i>
manifest	Clear or obvious to the eye or mind. <i>Manifest disapproval.</i>
noticeable	Undesirably noticeable. <i>Noticeable for its vivid historical background.</i>
observable	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i>Observable differences.</i>
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>It was an obvious remark to make.</i>
perceivable	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <i>Perceivable through the mist.</i>
perceptible	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>A perceptible decline in public confidence.</i>
plain	Sheer; simple (used for emphasis). <i>A plain round faced woman.</i>
self-evident	Evident without proof or argument.
standing out	Having a supporting base.
visible	In a position of public prominence. <i>A highly visible member of the royal entourage.</i>

Usage Examples of "Conspicuous" as an adjective

- *Wore conspicuous neckties.*
- *He showed conspicuous bravery.*
- *Made herself conspicuous by her exhibitionistic preening.*
- *He was very thin, with a conspicuous Adam's apple.*
- *A tower conspicuous at a great distance.*

apparent	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>For no apparent reason she laughed.</i>
appreciable	Large or important enough to be noticed. <i>Appreciable amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.</i>
detectable	Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible. <i>There is a detectable note of bitterness when he talks of his father.</i>

discernible	Able to be discerned; perceptible. <i>Things happen in the earth and sky with no discernible cause.</i>
distinctly	In a distinct and distinguishable manner. <i>It s distinctly possible.</i>
evident	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i>She ate the biscuits with evident enjoyment.</i>
flagrant	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>Flagrant violation of human rights.</i>
glaring	Shining intensely. <i>A glaring error.</i>
manifest	Record in a ship s manifest. <i>One deity manifested in the form of a bird.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>Well marked roads.</i>
memorable	Worth remembering or easily remembered, especially because of being special or unusual. <i>He recalled memorable moments in his life.</i>
notable	A celebrity who is an inspiration to others. <i>A notable increase in the crime rate.</i>
noted	Well known; famous. <i>A noted patron of the arts.</i>
noteworthy	Worthy of attention because interesting, significant, or unusual. <i>A noteworthy advance in cancer research.</i>
noticeable	Undesirably noticeable. <i>After a noticeable pause the lecturer continued.</i>
observable	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>Observable differences.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>Obvious errors.</i>
outstanding	Clearly noticeable. <i>Julian s outstanding debts.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
preeminent	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. <i>A preeminent archeologist.</i>
prominent	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. <i>A man with big prominent eyes like a lobster s.</i>

pronounced	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. A pronounced flavor of cinnamon.
remarkable	Worthy of attention because interesting, significant, or unusual. A remarkable coincidence.
renowned	Widely known and esteemed. A renowned painter.
<u>seemingly</u>	So as to give the impression of having a certain quality; apparently. A seemingly competent and well organized person.
<u>striking</u>	The action of striking. It is striking that no research into the problem is being carried out.
<u>substantial</u>	Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary- Shakespeare. Several substantial timber buildings.
uncanny	Surpassing the ordinary or normal - George Will. His uncanny sense of direction.
<u>visible</u>	Visible imports or exports. A visible supply.
visibly	In a visible manner. He was visibly irritated at the way he had been undermined.
