- Clearly visible.
- Attracting notice or attention.
- Obvious to the eye or mind.
- Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious.





## Synonyms of "Conspicuous" as an adjective (17 Words)

<u>apparent</u>	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>The committee investigated some</i> <b>apparent</b> <i>discrepancies</i> .
<u>blatant</u>	Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry. A <b>blatant</b> appeal to vanity.
<u>blazing</u>	Very hot. The delicious cool of marble corridors after the <b>blazing</b> heat outside.
<u>clear</u>	Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible. <i>Clear</i> and precise directions.
detectable	Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible. <i>The virus is not yet</i> <b>detectable</b> <i>in the blood</i> .
discernible	Perceptible by the senses or intellect. The newspaper reports no <b>discernible</b> progress in the negotiations.



<u>evident</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. She ate the biscuits with <b>evident</b> enjoyment.
<u>manifest</u>	Clear or obvious to the eye or mind. <i>Manifest</i> disapproval.
<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. <b>Noticeable</b> for its vivid historical background.
observable	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i>Observable differences</i> .
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. It was an <b>obvious</b> remark to make.
perceivable	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <b>Perceivable</b> through the mist.
perceptible	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. A <b>perceptible</b> decline in public confidence.
plain	Sheer; simple (used for emphasis. A <b>plain</b> round faced woman.
self-evident	Evident without proof or argument.
standing out	Having a supporting base.
<u>visible</u>	In a position of public prominence. A highly <b>visible</b> member of the royal entourage.

#### Usage Examples of "Conspicuous" as an adjective

- Wore conspicuous neckties.
- He showed conspicuous bravery.
- Made herself conspicuous by her exhibitionistic preening.
- He was very thin, with a conspicuous Adam's apple.
- A tower conspicuous at a great distance.

# Associations of "Conspicuous" (30 Words)

<u>apparent</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. For no <b>apparent</b> reason she laughed.
appreciable	Large or important enough to be noticed. <b>Appreciable</b> amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.
detectable	Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible. There is a <b>detectable</b> note of bitterness when he talks of his father.



discernible	Able to be discerned; perceptible. Things happen in the earth and sky with no <b>discernible</b> cause.
distinctly	In a distinct and distinguishable manner. It s <b>distinctly</b> possible.
<u>evident</u>	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i>She ate the biscuits with <b>evident</b> enjoyment.</i>
flagrant	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>Flagrant</i> violation of human rights.
<u>glaring</u>	Shining intensely. A <b>glaring</b> error.
<u>manifest</u>	Record in a ship s manifest. One deity <b>manifest</b> ed in the form of a bird.
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>Well <b>marked</b> roads.</i>
<u>memorable</u>	Worth remembering or easily remembered, especially because of being special or unusual. <i>He recalled memorable moments in his life.</i>
notable	A celebrity who is an inspiration to others. A <b>notable</b> increase in the crime rate.
noted	Well known; famous. A <b>noted</b> patron of the arts.
noteworthy	Worthy of attention because interesting, significant, or unusual. A <b>noteworthy</b> advance in cancer research.
<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. After a <b>noticeable</b> pause the lecturer continued.
observable	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>Observable</i> differences.
obvious	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>Obvious</i> errors.
outstanding	Clearly noticeable. Julian s <b>outstanding</b> debts.
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<u>preeminent</u>	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. A <b>preeminent</b> archeologist.
prominent	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. A man with big <b>prominent</b> eyes like a lobster s.



pronounced	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. A <b>pronounced</b> flavor of cinnamon.
remarkable	Worthy of attention because interesting, significant, or unusual. A <i>remarkable</i> coincidence.
renowned	Widely known and esteemed. A <b>renowned</b> painter.
seemingly	So as to give the impression of having a certain quality; apparently. A <i>seemingly</i> competent and well organized person.
<u>striking</u>	The action of striking. It is <b>striking</b> that no research into the problem is being carried out.
<u>substantial</u>	Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary- Shakespeare. Several <b>substantial</b> timber buildings.
uncanny	Surpassing the ordinary or normal – George Will. His <b>uncanny</b> sense of direction.
<u>visible</u>	Visible imports or exports. A <b>visible</b> supply.
visibly	In a visible manner. <i>He was <b>visibly</b> irritated at the way he had been undermined.</i>
