### Definitions of "Conspicuous" as an adjective

- *Clearly visible.*
- *Attracting notice or attention.*
- *Obvious to the eye or mind.*
- *Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious.*



## Synonyms of "Conspicuous" as an adjective (17 Words)

- apparent**      Appearing as such but not necessarily so.  
*The committee investigated some **apparent** discrepancies.*
- blatant**        Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry.  
*A **blatant** appeal to vanity.*
- blazing**        Very hot.  
*The delicious cool of marble corridors after the **blazing** heat outside.*
- clear**            Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible.  
***Clear** and precise directions.*
- detectable**    Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible.  
*The virus is not yet **detectable** in the blood.*
- discernible**    Perceptible by the senses or intellect.  
*The newspaper reports no **discernible** progress in the negotiations.*

<b>evident</b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>She ate the biscuits with <b>evident</b> enjoyment.</i>
<b>manifest</b>	Clear or obvious to the eye or mind. <i><b>Manifest</b> disapproval.</i>
<b>noticeable</b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i><b>Noticeable</b> for its vivid historical background.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i><b>Observable</b> differences.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>It was an <b>obvious</b> remark to make.</i>
<b>perceivable</b>	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <i><b>Perceivable</b> through the mist.</i>
<b>perceptible</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>A <b>perceptible</b> decline in public confidence.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Sheer; simple (used for emphasis). <i>A <b>plain</b> round faced woman.</i>
<b>self-evident</b>	Evident without proof or argument.
<b>standing out</b>	Having a supporting base.
<b>visible</b>	In a position of public prominence. <i>A highly <b>visible</b> member of the royal entourage.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Conspicuous" as an adjective

- *Wore conspicuous neckties.*
- *He showed conspicuous bravery.*
- *Made herself conspicuous by her exhibitionistic preening.*
- *He was very thin, with a conspicuous Adam's apple.*
- *A tower conspicuous at a great distance.*

<b>appreciable</b>	Large or important enough to be noticed. <i><b>Appreciable</b> amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.</i>
<b>detectable</b>	Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible. <i>There is a <b>detectable</b> note of bitterness when he talks of his father.</i>

<b>discernible</b>	Able to be discerned; perceptible. <i>Things happen in the earth and sky with no <b>discernible</b> cause.</i>
<b>distinctly</b>	In a distinct and distinguishable manner. <i>It s <b>distinctly</b> possible.</i>
<b>evident</b>	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i>She ate the biscuits with <b>evident</b> enjoyment.</i>
<b>flagrant</b>	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i><b>Flagrant</b> violation of human rights.</i>
<b>glaring</b>	Shining intensely. <i>A <b>glaring</b> error.</i>
<b>manifest</b>	Record in a ship s manifest. <i>One deity <b>manifested</b> in the form of a bird.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>Well <b>marked</b> roads.</i>
<b>memorable</b>	Worth remembering or easily remembered, especially because of being special or unusual. <i>He recalled <b>memorable</b> moments in his life.</i>
<b>notable</b>	A celebrity who is an inspiration to others. <i>A <b>notable</b> increase in the crime rate.</i>
<b>noted</b>	Well known; famous. <i>A <b>noted</b> patron of the arts.</i>
<b>noteworthy</b>	Worthy of attention because interesting, significant, or unusual. <i>A <b>noteworthy</b> advance in cancer research.</i>
<b>noticeable</b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>After a <b>noticeable</b> pause the lecturer continued.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i><b>Observable</b> differences.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i><b>Obvious</b> errors.</i>
<b>outstanding</b>	Clearly noticeable. <i>Julian s <b>outstanding</b> debts.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b>preeminent</b>	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. <i>A <b>preeminent</b> archeologist.</i>
<b>prominent</b>	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. <i>A man with big <b>prominent</b> eyes like a lobster s.</i>

<b>pronounced</b>	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. A <b>pronounced</b> flavor of cinnamon.
<b>remarkable</b>	Worthy of attention because interesting, significant, or unusual. A <b>remarkable</b> coincidence.
<b>renowned</b>	Widely known and esteemed. A <b>renowned</b> painter.
<b>seemingly</b>	So as to give the impression of having a certain quality; apparently. A <b>seemingly</b> competent and well organized person.
<b>striking</b>	The action of striking. It is <b>striking</b> that no research into the problem is being carried out.
<b>substantial</b>	Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary- Shakespeare. Several <b>substantial</b> timber buildings.
<b>uncanny</b>	Surpassing the ordinary or normal - George Will. His <b>uncanny</b> sense of direction.
<b>visible</b>	Visible imports or exports. A <b>visible</b> supply.
<b>visibly</b>	In a visible manner. He was <b>visibly</b> irritated at the way he had been undermined.
