## **Constellation as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Constellation" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “constellation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A group of associated or similar people or things.*
- *A configuration of stars as seen from the earth.*
- *An arrangement of parts or elements.*
- *A group of stars forming a recognizable pattern that is traditionally named after its apparent form or identified with a mythological figure.*



## Synonyms of "Constellation" as a noun (4 Words)

### cluster

A group of similar things or people positioned or occurring closely together.  
*There are several **clusters** in Cassiopeia.*

### configuration

The arrangement or set-up of the hardware and software that make up a computer system.  
*The PC comes with a removable hard disk drive as part of the standard **configuration**.*

### **nebula**

A faint cloudy spot on the cornea.

### **star system**

A plane figure with 5 or more points; often used as an emblem.





## Usage Examples of "Constellation" as a noun

- *No two patients ever show exactly the same constellation of symptoms.*





## Associations of "Constellation" (30 Words)

**achievement** A representation of a coat of arms with all the adjuncts to which a bearer of arms is entitled.

*The **achievement** of professional recognition.*

**asterisk**

Mark a word or piece of text with an asterisk.

*He had **asterisked** the things about the case that still bothered him.*

**astral**

Relating to or resembling the stars.

*An **astral** body.*

**astrology**

The study of the movements and relative positions of celestial bodies interpreted as having an influence on human affairs and the natural world.

**astronomy**

The branch of science which deals with celestial objects, space, and the physical universe as a whole.

**cosmic**

Inconceivably extended in space or time.

*The **cosmic** void.*

<b>cosmogony</b>	The branch of astrophysics that studies the origin and evolution and structure of the universe. <i>In their <b>cosmogony</b> the world was thought to be a square flat surface.</i>
<b>distant</b>	(of a person) not closely related. <i>The star is 30 000 light years <b>distant</b> from Earth.</i>
<b>far</b>	To an advanced stage or point. <i>A <b>far</b> trek.</i>
<b>galaxy</b>	The galaxy of which the solar system is a part the Milky Way. <i>Extragalactic nebula is a former name for <b>galaxy</b>.</i>
<b>horoscope</b>	A short forecast for people born under a particular sign, especially as published in a newspaper or magazine. <i>My <b>horoscope</b> said it was time to do something for myself so I phoned Georgia that evening.</i>
<b>interstellar</b>	Occurring or situated between stars. <i><b>Interstellar</b> travel.</i>
<b>libra</b>	A person who is born while the sun is in Libra.
<b>lunar</b>	Of, determined by, or resembling the moon. <i>A <b>lunar</b> landscape.</i>
<b>major</b>	A major organization or competition. <i>The oil <b>majors</b> had a profit bonanza.</i>
<b>nebula</b>	Cloudiness of the urine.
<b>notable</b>	A famous or important person. <i>The results with one <b>notable</b> exception have been superb.</i>
<b>outshine</b>	Shine more brightly than. <i>What star <b>outshines</b> the sun.</i>
<b>overshadow</b>	Cast a shadow upon. <i>The tall tree <b>overshadowed</b> the house.</i>
<b>planetary</b>	Having no fixed course. <i>A <b>planetary</b> system.</i>
<b>prima</b>	Used primarily as eating apples. <i><b>Prima</b> donna.</i>
<b>remarkable</b>	Worthy of attention; striking. <i>A <b>remarkable</b> achievement.</i>
<b>solar</b>	Relating to or determined by the sun. <i><b>Solar</b> heating.</i>

- star** Used in names of starfishes and similar echinoderms with five or more radiating arms e.g. cushion star brittlestar.  
*His golf destiny was written in the **stars**.*
- stellar** Relating to a star or stars.  
*A **stellar** role.*
- supernova** A star that suddenly increases greatly in brightness because of a catastrophic explosion that ejects most of its mass.
- superstar** Someone who is dazzlingly skilled in any field.  
*He became a **superstar** overnight.*
- universe** All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago.  
*They study the evolution of the **universe**.*
- victory** An act of defeating an enemy or opponent in a battle, game, or other competition.  
*The general always gets credit for his army's **victory**.*
- virgo** A person who is born while the sun is in Virgo.
