Definitions of "Constellation" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “constellation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A group of associated or similar people or things.*
- *A configuration of stars as seen from the earth.*
- *An arrangement of parts or elements.*
- *A group of stars forming a recognizable pattern that is traditionally named after its apparent form or identified with a mythological figure.*



Synonyms of "Constellation" as a noun (4 Words)

cluster

A group of similar things or people positioned or occurring closely together.
*There are several **clusters** in Cassiopeia.*

configuration

The arrangement or set-up of the hardware and software that make up a computer system.
*The PC comes with a removable hard disk drive as part of the standard **configuration**.*

nebula

A faint cloudy spot on the cornea.

star system

A plane figure with 5 or more points; often used as an emblem.



Usage Examples of "Constellation" as a noun

- *No two patients ever show exactly the same constellation of symptoms.*



Associations of "Constellation" (30 Words)

achievement A representation of a coat of arms with all the adjuncts to which a bearer of arms is entitled.

*The **achievement** of professional recognition.*

asterisk

Mark a word or piece of text with an asterisk.

*He had **asterisked** the things about the case that still bothered him.*

astral

Relating to or resembling the stars.

*An **astral** body.*

astrology

The study of the movements and relative positions of celestial bodies interpreted as having an influence on human affairs and the natural world.

astronomy

The branch of science which deals with celestial objects, space, and the physical universe as a whole.

cosmic

Inconceivably extended in space or time.

*The **cosmic** void.*

cosmogony	The branch of astrophysics that studies the origin and evolution and structure of the universe. <i>In their cosmogony the world was thought to be a square flat surface.</i>
distant	(of a person) not closely related. <i>The star is 30 000 light years distant from Earth.</i>
far	To an advanced stage or point. <i>A far trek.</i>
galaxy	The galaxy of which the solar system is a part the Milky Way. <i>Extragalactic nebula is a former name for galaxy.</i>
horoscope	A short forecast for people born under a particular sign, especially as published in a newspaper or magazine. <i>My horoscope said it was time to do something for myself so I phoned Georgia that evening.</i>
interstellar	Occurring or situated between stars. <i>Interstellar travel.</i>
libra	A person who is born while the sun is in Libra.
lunar	Of, determined by, or resembling the moon. <i>A lunar landscape.</i>
major	A major organization or competition. <i>The oil majors had a profit bonanza.</i>
nebula	Cloudiness of the urine.
notable	A famous or important person. <i>The results with one notable exception have been superb.</i>
outshine	Shine more brightly than. <i>What star outshines the sun.</i>
overshadow	Cast a shadow upon. <i>The tall tree overshadowed the house.</i>
planetary	Having no fixed course. <i>A planetary system.</i>
prima	Used primarily as eating apples. <i>Prima donna.</i>
remarkable	Worthy of attention; striking. <i>A remarkable achievement.</i>
solar	Relating to or determined by the sun. <i>Solar heating.</i>

<u>star</u>	Used in names of starfishes and similar echinoderms with five or more radiating arms e g cushion star brittlestar. <i>His golf destiny was written in the stars.</i>
<u>stellar</u>	Relating to a star or stars. <i>A stellar role.</i>
supernova	A star that suddenly increases greatly in brightness because of a catastrophic explosion that ejects most of its mass.
<u>superstar</u>	Someone who is dazzlingly skilled in any field. <i>He became a superstar overnight.</i>
<u>universe</u>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>They study the evolution of the universe.</i>
<u>victory</u>	An act of defeating an enemy or opponent in a battle, game, or other competition. <i>The general always gets credit for his army s victory.</i>
virgo	A person who is born while the sun is in Virgo.
