- *The body of voters who elect a representative for their area.*
- *A group of people with shared interests or political opinions.*



## Synonyms of "Constituency" as a noun (17 Words)

<b>area</b>	A particular geographical region of indefinite boundary (usually serving some special purpose or distinguished by its people or culture or geography. <i>Areas of the body.</i>
<b>block</b>	An act of blocking someone or something. <i>We had to call a plumber to clear out the <b>blockage</b> in the drainpipe.</i>
<b>community</b>	A group of people having a religion, ethnic, profession, or other particular characteristic in common. <i>They formed a <b>community</b> of scientists.</i>
<b>domain</b>	People in general; especially a distinctive group of people with some shared interest. <i>The country's isolation in the <b>domain</b> of sport.</i>
<b>locale</b>	The scene of any event or action (especially the place of a meeting). <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic <b>locales</b>.</i>

<b>locality</b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The rock s size and <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>neighbourhood</b>	A district or community within a town or city. <i>She lived in a wealthy <b>neighbourhood</b> of Boston.</i>
<b>part</b>	The melody carried by a particular voice or instrument in polyphonic music. <i>Body <b>parts</b>.</i>
<b>patch</b>	A small disc of black silk worn attached to the face for adornment by women in the 17th and 18th centuries. <i>Once the <b>patch</b> is removed the drug clears from the body tissue after twenty minutes.</i>
<b>place</b>	An abstract mental location. <i>That street was no <b>place</b> for a lady.</i>
<b>quarter</b>	A coin representing 25 cents a quarter of a US or Canadian dollar. <i>He fed four <b>quarters</b> into the slot machine.</i>
<b>region</b>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>In the abdominal <b>region</b>.</i>
<b>sector</b>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>The government aimed to reassure the industrial and commercial <b>sector</b>.</i>
<b>spot</b>	A short section or illustration (as between radio or tv programs or in a magazine) that is often used for advertising. <i>The runner up <b>spot</b>.</i>
<b>territory</b>	An area of knowledge or interest. <i>Male blackbirds try to attract as many females to their <b>territory</b> as possible.</i>
<b>vicinity</b>	The area near or surrounding a particular place. <i>The plane crashed in the <b>vicinity</b> of Asheville.</i>
<b>zone</b>	A range of longitudes where a common standard time is used. <i>I was in the <b>zone</b> completing the first nine holes in one under par.</i>

- *The right needed to move beyond its blue-blood constituency.*

## Associations of "Constituency" (30 Words)

<b>area</b>	A region or part of a town, a country, or the world. <i>The <b>area</b> of a triangle.</i>
<b>autonomous</b>	Having the freedom to act independently. <i>An <b>autonomous</b> judiciary.</i>
<b>autonomy</b>	The right or condition of self-government. <i>The courts enjoy a considerable degree of <b>autonomy</b>.</i>
<b>borough</b>	A town or district which is an administrative unit.
<b>city</b>	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>The <b>city</b> raised the tax rate.</i>
<b>county</b>	A sporting team playing for a county. <i>Administration at <b>county</b> level.</i>
<b>district</b>	Regulate housing in; of certain areas of towns. <i>The committee <b>districted</b> the city into blocks.</i>
<b>domestic</b>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i><b>Domestic</b> animals.</i>
<b>elect</b>	Select by a vote for an office or membership. <i>One of the <b>elect</b> who have power inside the government.</i>
<b>election</b>	The act of selecting someone or something; the exercise of deliberate choice. <i>The 1860 presidential <b>election</b>.</i>
<b>electorate</b>	All the people in a country or area who are entitled to vote in an election. <i>75 per cent of the <b>electorate</b> voted for a Scottish parliament in some form.</i>
<b>enfranchise</b>	Free (a slave). <i>Slaves were <b>enfranchised</b> in the mid 19th century.</i>
<b>legislature</b>	Persons who make or amend or repeal laws. <i>The Nevada state <b>legislature</b> passed a law to prohibit dumping of nuclear waste.</i>
<b>local</b>	Of or belonging to or characteristic of a particular locality or neighborhood. <i>The <b>local</b> post office.</i>
<b>locality</b>	The position or site of something. <i>The rock s size and <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>metropolitan</b>	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A <b>metropolitan</b> bishop.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i><b>Municipal</b> offices.</i>

<b>municipality</b>	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each <b>municipality</b> choose between four candidates.</i>
<b><u>national</u></b>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>Plans for a <b>national</b> art library.</i>
<b>parliament</b>	A legislature similar to the UK Parliament in other nations and states. <i>It is uncommon to see a <b>parliament</b> of owls in the wild.</i>
<b>plebiscite</b>	A law enacted by the plebeians' assembly. <i>The administration will hold a <b>plebiscite</b> for the approval of constitutional reforms.</i>
<b>prefecture</b>	A prefect's office or tenure. <i>Enraged fans besieged the <b>Prefecture</b> of Police.</i>
<b><u>province</u></b>	The proper sphere or extent of your activities. <i>She knew little about wine that had been her father's <b>province</b>.</i>
<b><u>provincial</u></b>	Characteristic of the provinces or their people. <i>The general of the Jesuits receives monthly reports from the <b>provincials</b>.</i>
<b>quarter</b>	The haunches or hindquarters of a horse. <i>The wind is coming from that <b>quarter</b>.</i>
<b>referendum</b>	A legislative act is referred for final approval to a popular vote by the electorate.
<b>sovereignty</b>	The authority of a state to govern itself or another state. <i>National <b>sovereignty</b>.</i>
<b>subdivide</b>	Divide into smaller and smaller pieces. <i>This apartment cannot be <b>subdivided</b> any further.</i>
<b><u>vote</u></b>	Express one's preference for a candidate or for a measure or resolution cast a vote. <i>I <b>voted</b> Labour.</i>
<b>voter</b>	A citizen who has a legal right to vote.
