- *The body of voters who elect a representative for their area.*
- *A group of people with shared interests or political opinions.*



Synonyms of "Constituency" as a noun (17 Words)

area	A particular geographical region of indefinite boundary (usually serving some special purpose or distinguished by its people or culture or geography. <i>Areas of the body.</i>
block	An act of blocking someone or something. <i>We had to call a plumber to clear out the blockage in the drainpipe.</i>
community	A group of people having a religion, ethnic, profession, or other particular characteristic in common. <i>They formed a community of scientists.</i>
domain	People in general; especially a distinctive group of people with some shared interest. <i>The country's isolation in the domain of sport.</i>
locale	The scene of any event or action (especially the place of a meeting). <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic locales.</i>

locality	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The rock s size and locality.</i>
neighbourhood	A district or community within a town or city. <i>She lived in a wealthy neighbourhood of Boston.</i>
part	The melody carried by a particular voice or instrument in polyphonic music. <i>Body parts.</i>
patch	A small disc of black silk worn attached to the face for adornment by women in the 17th and 18th centuries. <i>Once the patch is removed the drug clears from the body tissue after twenty minutes.</i>
place	An abstract mental location. <i>That street was no place for a lady.</i>
quarter	A coin representing 25 cents a quarter of a US or Canadian dollar. <i>He fed four quarters into the slot machine.</i>
region	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>In the abdominal region.</i>
sector	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>The government aimed to reassure the industrial and commercial sector.</i>
spot	A short section or illustration (as between radio or tv programs or in a magazine) that is often used for advertising. <i>The runner up spot.</i>
territory	An area of knowledge or interest. <i>Male blackbirds try to attract as many females to their territory as possible.</i>
vicinity	The area near or surrounding a particular place. <i>The plane crashed in the vicinity of Asheville.</i>
zone	A range of longitudes where a common standard time is used. <i>I was in the zone completing the first nine holes in one under par.</i>

- *The right needed to move beyond its blue-blood constituency.*

autonomous	Having the freedom to act independently. <i>An autonomous judiciary.</i>
autonomy	The right or condition of self-government. <i>The courts enjoy a considerable degree of autonomy.</i>
borough	A town or district which is an administrative unit.
city	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>The city raised the tax rate.</i>
county	A sporting team playing for a county. <i>Administration at county level.</i>
district	Regulate housing in; of certain areas of towns. <i>The committee districted the city into blocks.</i>
domestic	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>Domestic animals.</i>

electorate	All the people in a country or area who are entitled to vote in an election. <i>75 per cent of the electorate voted for a Scottish parliament in some form.</i>
enfranchise	Free (a slave). <i>Slaves were enfranchised in the mid 19th century.</i>
legislature	Persons who make or amend or repeal laws. <i>The Nevada state legislature passed a law to prohibit dumping of nuclear waste.</i>
local	Of or belonging to or characteristic of a particular locality or neighborhood. <i>The local post office.</i>
locality	The position or site of something. <i>The rock s size and locality.</i>
metropolitan	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A metropolitan bishop.</i>
municipal	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i>Municipal offices.</i>

municipality	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each municipality choose between four candidates.</i>
<u>national</u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>Plans for a national art library.</i>
parliament	A legislature similar to the UK Parliament in other nations and states. <i>It is uncommon to see a parliament of owls in the wild.</i>
plebiscite	A law enacted by the plebeians' assembly. <i>The administration will hold a plebiscite for the approval of constitutional reforms.</i>
prefecture	A prefect's office or tenure. <i>Enraged fans besieged the Prefecture of Police.</i>
<u>province</u>	The proper sphere or extent of your activities. <i>She knew little about wine that had been her father's province.</i>
<u>provincial</u>	Characteristic of the provinces or their people. <i>The general of the Jesuits receives monthly reports from the provincials.</i>
quarter	The haunches or hindquarters of a horse. <i>The wind is coming from that quarter.</i>
referendum	A legislative act is referred for final approval to a popular vote by the electorate.
sovereignty	The authority of a state to govern itself or another state. <i>National sovereignty.</i>
subdivide	Divide into smaller and smaller pieces. <i>This apartment cannot be subdivided any further.</i>
<u>vote</u>	Express one's preference for a candidate or for a measure or resolution cast a vote. <i>I voted Labour.</i>
voter	A citizen who has a legal right to vote.
