<b>ingredient</b>	Any of the foods or substances that are combined to make a particular dish. <i>Humor an effective <b>ingredient</b> of a speech.</i>
<b>member of a constituency</b>	Anything that belongs to a set or class.
<b>member of the electorate</b>	An external body part that projects from the body.
<b>part</b>	The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one s duty. <i>The written <b>part</b> of the exam.</i>
<b>portion</b>	An individual quantity of food or drink taken as part of a meal. <i>I read a <b>portion</b> of the manuscript.</i>
<b>voter</b>	A citizen who has a legal right to vote.

<b>commons</b>	Land or resources belonging to or affecting the whole of a community. <i>Both lords and commons won some important concessions.</i>
<b>component</b>	Each of two or more forces, velocities, or other vectors acting in different directions which are together equivalent to a given vector. <i>He resolved the motion into horizontal and vertical components.</i>
<b>composition</b>	An essay, especially one written by a school or college student. <i>The composition of forces.</i>
<b>consist</b>	Be consistent with. <i>Desires are to be satisfied only so far as consists with an approved end.</i>
<b>courteous</b>	Characterized by courtesy and gracious good manners-Francis Bacon. <i>A courteous young man.</i>
<b>courtesy</b>	The showing of politeness in one's attitude and behaviour towards others. <i>He treated the players with courtesy and good humour.</i>
<b>disfranchise</b>	Deprive of voting rights.
<b>disunion</b>	The termination or destruction of union. <i>His rejection of disunion was consistent with his nationalism.</i>
<b>divisor</b>	A number by which another number is to be divided. <i>The greatest common divisor.</i>
<b>element</b>	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i.e. the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>Extreme right wing elements in the army.</i>
<b>elemental</b>	A supernatural entity or force thought to be physically manifested by occult means. <i>Gods and elementals looked out upon the worshippers.</i>
<b>ethnicity</b>	The quality or fact of belonging to a population group or subgroup made up of people who share a common cultural background or descent. <i>The interrelationship between gender ethnicity and class.</i>
<b>etiquette</b>	The customary code of polite behaviour in society or among members of a particular profession or group. <i>Court etiquette was now familiar to Joan.</i>

<b>factor</b>	Of a company sell its invoices to a factor. <i>A quantum computer can <b>factor</b> the number 15.</i>
<b>ingredient</b>	A component part or element of something. <i>Pork is an important <b>ingredient</b> in many stir fried dishes.</i>
<b>magistrate</b>	A civil officer who administers the law, especially one who conducts a court that deals with minor offences and holds preliminary hearings for more serious ones.
<b>militate</b>	(of a fact or circumstance) be a powerful or conclusive factor in preventing. <i>These fundamental differences will <b>militate</b> against the two communities coming together.</i>
<b>module</b>	A self-contained component (unit or item) that is used in combination with other components. <i>A networking <b>module</b>.</i>
<b>nationality</b>	People having common origins or traditions and often comprising a nation. <i>Such images define their sense of <b>nationality</b>.</i>
<b>polite</b>	Not rude; marked by satisfactory (or especially minimal) adherence to social usages and sufficient but not noteworthy consideration for others. <i><b>Polite</b> society.</i>
<b>secession</b>	Formal separation from an alliance or federation. <i>The republics want <b>secession</b> from the union.</i>
<b>social</b>	An informal social gathering especially one organized by the members of a particular club or group. <i>Alcoholism is recognized as a major <b>social</b> problem.</i>
