disunion	The termination or destruction of union. <i>His rejection of disunion was consistent with his nationalism.</i>
divisor	One of two or more integers that can be exactly divided into another integer. <i>The greatest common divisor.</i>
element	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i e the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>Extreme right wing elements in the army.</i>

elemental	Concerned with chemical elements or other basic components. <i>Elemental sulphur.</i>
ethnicity	An ethnic quality or affiliation resulting from racial or cultural ties. <i>The interrelationship between gender ethnicity and class.</i>
etiquette	The customary code of polite behaviour in society or among members of a particular profession or group. <i>Etiquette books.</i>

polite	Relating to people who regard themselves as more cultured and refined than others. <i>The picture outraged polite society.</i>
secession	Formal separation from an alliance or federation. <i>The republics want secession from the union.</i>
social	An informal social gathering especially one organized by the members of a particular club or group. <i>Guy led a full social life.</i>
uprising	Organized opposition to authority; a conflict in which one faction tries to wrest control from another. <i>An armed uprising.</i>
