<b>composition</b>	The spatial property resulting from the arrangement of parts in relation to each other and to the whole. <i>The <b>composition</b> is written in four movements.</i>
<b>consist</b>	Be consistent in form tenor or character be congruous. <i>The information perfectly <b>consists</b> with our friend s account.</i>
<b>courteous</b>	Characterized by courtesy and gracious good manners. <i>A <b>courteous</b> young man.</i>
<b>courtesy</b>	(especially of transport) supplied free of charge to people who are already paying for another service. <i>A <b>courtesy</b> car.</i>
<b>disfranchise</b>	Deprive of voting rights.
<b>disunion</b>	The termination or destruction of union. <i>His rejection of <b>disunion</b> was consistent with his nationalism.</i>
<b>divisor</b>	One of two or more integers that can be exactly divided into another integer. <i>The greatest common <b>divisor</b>.</i>
<b>element</b>	Each of more than one hundred substances that cannot be chemically interconverted or broken down into simpler substances and are primary constituents of matter Each element is distinguished by its atomic number i e the number of protons in the nuclei of its atoms. <i>Extreme right wing <b>elements</b> in the army.</i>

<b>elemental</b>	Concerned with chemical elements or other basic components. <i><b>Elemental</b> sulphur.</i>
<b>ethnicity</b>	An ethnic quality or affiliation resulting from racial or cultural ties. <i>The interrelationship between gender <b>ethnicity</b> and class.</i>
<b>etiquette</b>	The customary code of polite behaviour in society or among members of a particular profession or group. <i><b>Etiquette</b> books.</i>
<b>factor</b>	With numeral a sunscreen of the sun protection factor specified. <i>A key <b>factor</b> in her success.</i>
<b>ingredient</b>	A component of a mixture or compound. <i>Humor an effective <b>ingredient</b> of a speech.</i>
<b>magistrate</b>	A lay judge or civil authority who administers the law (especially one who conducts a court dealing with minor offenses.

<b>nationality</b>	The status of belonging to a particular nation by birth or naturalization. <i>Men of Spanish <b>nationality</b>.</i>
<b>polite</b>	Relating to people who regard themselves as more cultured and refined than others. <i>The picture outraged <b>polite</b> society.</i>
<b>secession</b>	Formal separation from an alliance or federation. <i>The republics want <b>secession</b> from the union.</i>
<b>social</b>	An informal social gathering especially one organized by the members of a particular club or group. <i>Guy led a full <b>social</b> life.</i>
