Associations of "Consumerism" (30 Words)

behaviorism	An approach to psychology that emphasizes observable measurable behavior.
capitalism	An economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of capitalism.</i>
conservative	Unimaginatively conventional- Newsweek. <i>The Massachusetts liberal who conservatives love to hate.</i>
empiricism	Medical practice and advice based on observation and experience in ignorance of scientific findings.
exaggerated	Represented as greater than is true or reasonable. <i>Comic book characters are drawn with exaggerated features so you will remember them.</i>
excessive	Beyond normal limits. <i>He was drinking excessive amounts of brandy.</i>
excessively	To a greater degree or in greater amounts than is necessary, normal, or desirable; inordinately. <i>They don t drink excessively.</i>
formalism	The practice of scrupulous adherence to prescribed or external forms. <i>There is a formalism which expresses the idea of superposition.</i>
functionalism	The theory that all aspects of a society serve a function and are necessary for the survival of that society.
greed	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>Greed has taken over football.</i>
immoderate	Not sensible or restrained; excessive. <i>Immoderate drinking.</i>

<u>inordinate</u>	Beyond normal limits. <i>A book of inordinate length.</i>
intemperate	(of weather or climate) not mild; subject to extremes. <i>An intemperate climate.</i>
materialism	The philosophical theory that matter is the only reality. <i>They hated the sinful materialism of the wicked city.</i>
modernism	The quality of being current or of the present. <i>A strange mix of nostalgia and modernism.</i>
neutrality	Tolerance attributable to a lack of involvement. <i>The clinical neutrality of the description.</i>
<u>objectivity</u>	The quality of being objective. <i>The piece lacked any objectivity.</i>
observational	Relating to the action or process of closely observing or watching something or someone. <i>The observational skills of a journalist.</i>
<u>overly</u>	Excessively. <i>She was a jealous and overly possessive woman.</i>
positivism	A humanistic religious system founded on positivism.
rationalism	The practice of treating reason as the ultimate authority in religion. <i>Scientific rationalism.</i>
scientific	Based on or characterized by the methods and principles of science. <i>Scientific instruments.</i>
structuralism	A sociological theory based on the premise that society comes before individuals.
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
<u>too</u>	Moreover (used when adding a further point). <i>He wore suits that seemed a size too small for him.</i>
<u>undue</u>	Lacking justification or authorization. <i>Undue influence.</i>
<u>unjustified</u>	(of printed text) not justified. <i>Unjustified price increases.</i>
<u>unwarranted</u>	Without a basis in reason or fact. <i>I am sure your fears are unwarranted.</i>
utilitarianism	The doctrine that actions are right if they are useful or for the benefit of a majority.
weariness	Reluctance to see or experience any more of something. <i>He began to feel weariness.</i>
