## Associations of "Consumerism" (30 Words)

<b>behaviorism</b>	An approach to psychology that emphasizes observable measurable behavior.
<b>capitalism</b>	An economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of <b>capitalism</b>.</i>
<b>conservative</b>	Unimaginatively conventional- Newsweek. <i>The Massachusetts liberal who <b>conservatives</b> love to hate.</i>
<b>empiricism</b>	Medical practice and advice based on observation and experience in ignorance of scientific findings.
<b>exaggerated</b>	Represented as greater than is true or reasonable. <i>Comic book characters are drawn with <b>exaggerated</b> features so you will remember them.</i>
<b>excessive</b>	Beyond normal limits. <i>He was drinking <b>excessive</b> amounts of brandy.</i>
<b>excessively</b>	To a greater degree or in greater amounts than is necessary, normal, or desirable; inordinately. <i>They don t drink <b>excessively</b>.</i>
<b>formalism</b>	The practice of scrupulous adherence to prescribed or external forms. <i>There is a <b>formalism</b> which expresses the idea of superposition.</i>
<b>functionalism</b>	The theory that all aspects of a society serve a function and are necessary for the survival of that society.
<b>greed</b>	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i><b>Greed</b> has taken over football.</i>
<b>immoderate</b>	Not sensible or restrained; excessive. <i><b>Immoderate</b> drinking.</i>

<b><u>inordinate</u></b>	Beyond normal limits. <i>A book of <b>inordinate</b> length.</i>
<b>intemperate</b>	(of weather or climate) not mild; subject to extremes. <i>An <b>intemperate</b> climate.</i>
<b>materialism</b>	The philosophical theory that matter is the only reality. <i>They hated the sinful <b>materialism</b> of the wicked city.</i>
<b>modernism</b>	The quality of being current or of the present. <i>A strange mix of nostalgia and <b>modernism</b>.</i>
<b>neutrality</b>	Tolerance attributable to a lack of involvement. <i>The clinical <b>neutrality</b> of the description.</i>
<b><u>objectivity</u></b>	The quality of being objective. <i>The piece lacked any <b>objectivity</b>.</i>
<b>observational</b>	Relating to the action or process of closely observing or watching something or someone. <i>The <b>observational</b> skills of a journalist.</i>
<b><u>overly</u></b>	Excessively. <i>She was a jealous and <b>overly</b> possessive woman.</i>
<b>positivism</b>	A humanistic religious system founded on positivism.
<b>rationalism</b>	The practice of treating reason as the ultimate authority in religion. <i>Scientific <b>rationalism</b>.</i>
<b>scientific</b>	Based on or characterized by the methods and principles of science. <i><b>Scientific</b> instruments.</i>
<b>structuralism</b>	A sociological theory based on the premise that society comes before individuals.
<b>superabundance</b>	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
<b><u>too</u></b>	Moreover (used when adding a further point). <i>He wore suits that seemed a size <b>too</b> small for him.</i>
<b><u>undue</u></b>	Lacking justification or authorization. <i><b>Undue</b> influence.</i>
<b><u>unjustified</u></b>	(of printed text) not justified. <i><b>Unjustified</b> price increases.</i>
<b><u>unwarranted</u></b>	Without a basis in reason or fact. <i>I am sure your fears are <b>unwarranted</b>.</i>
<b>utilitarianism</b>	The doctrine that actions are right if they are useful or for the benefit of a majority.
<b>weariness</b>	Reluctance to see or experience any more of something. <i>He began to feel <b>weariness</b>.</i>
