**link**

The means of connection between things linked in series.

*A chain made of steel **links**.*

**middleman**

Someone who buys large quantities of goods and resells to merchants rather than to the ultimate customers.

*We maintain value for money by cutting out the **middleman** and selling direct.*

**striking**

The action of striking.

*Substantial damage was caused by the **striking** of a submerged object.*

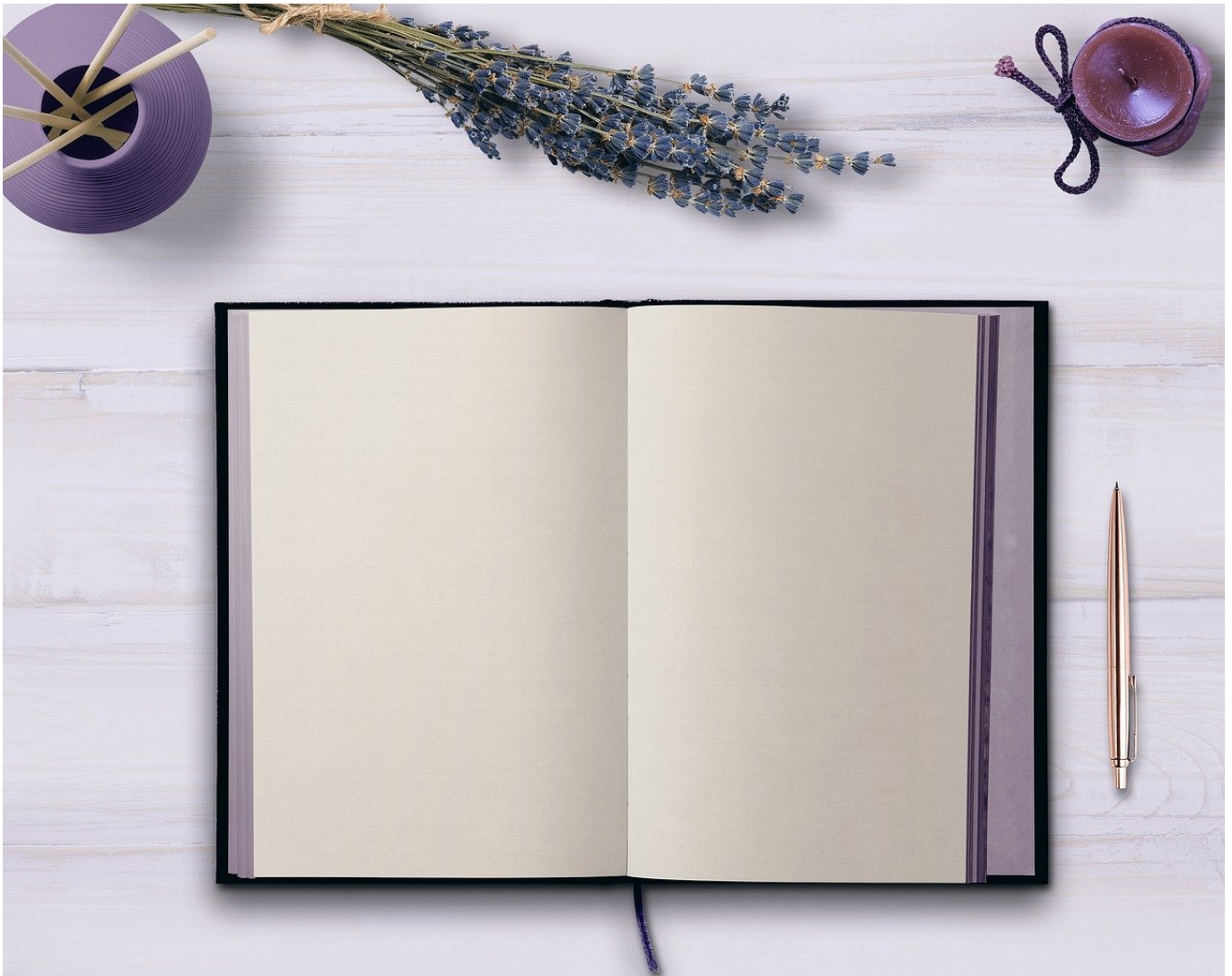
**tangency**

(electronics) a junction where things (as two electrical conductors) touch or are in physical contact.

**touch**

An act of touching someone or something.

*This room needs a woman s **touch**.*



## Usage Examples of "Contacts" as a noun

- *Litmus paper turns red on contact with an acid.*

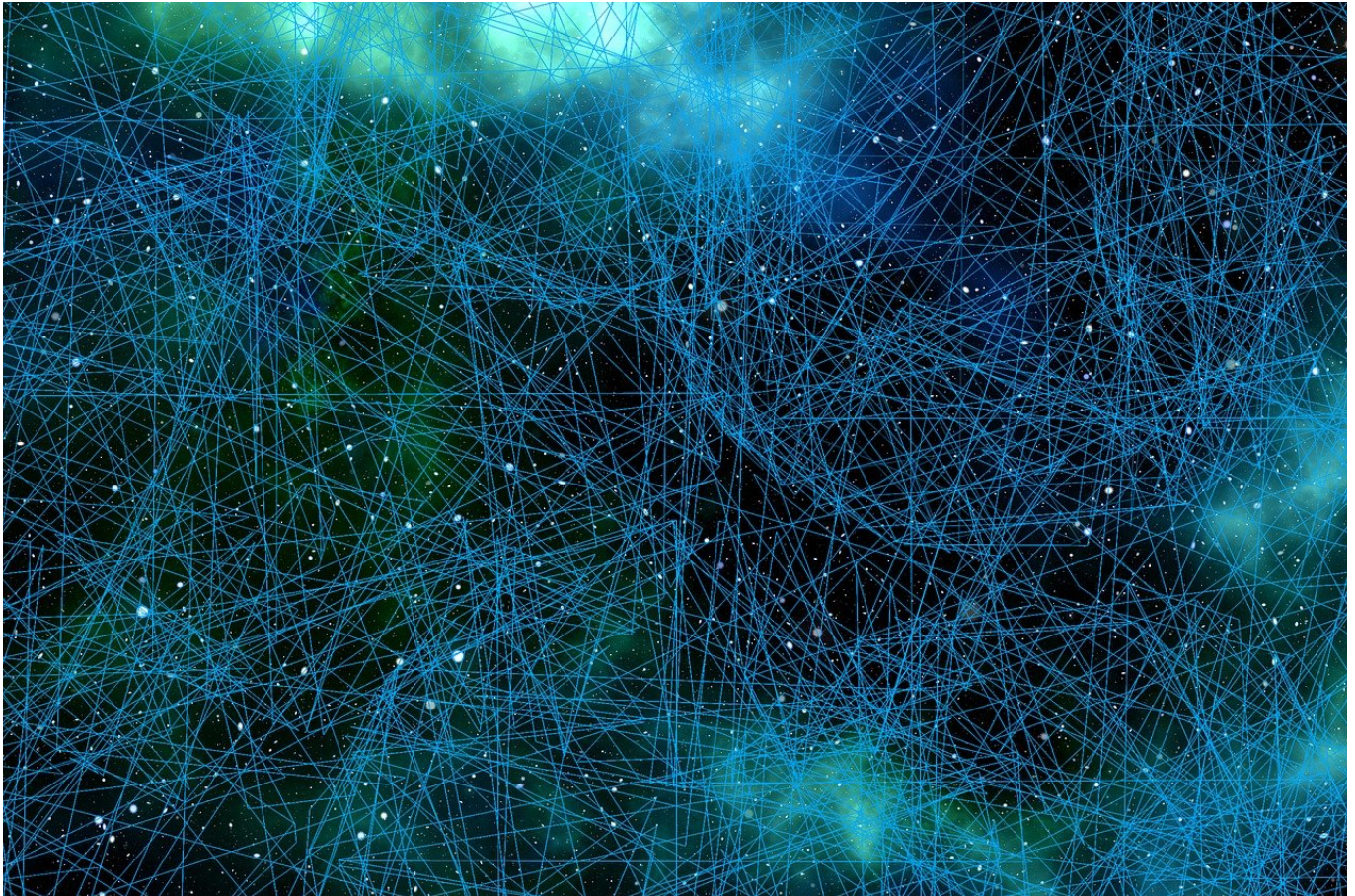


# Contacts as a Verb

## Definitions of "Contacts" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "contacts" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Be in direct physical contact with; make contact.*
- *Be in or establish communication with.*



## Synonyms of "Contacts" as a verb (6 Words)

**adjoin** Lie adjacent to another or share a boundary.  
*Canada **adjoins** the U.S.*

**get hold of** Receive as a retribution or punishment.

**get through** Receive a specified treatment (abstract).

- meet** Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condition no restriction.  
***Meet** a violent death.*
- reach** Reach a goal e.g.  
*Television **reached** those parts of the electorate that other news sources could not.*
- touch** Perceive via the tactile sense.  
*There is no one who can **touch** him at lightweight judo.*



### Usage Examples of "Contacts" as a verb

- *The surfaces contact at this point.*
- *The wire must not contact the metal cover.*
- *He never contacted his children after he emigrated to Australia.*

- accessibility** The quality of being easily reached, entered, or used by people who have a disability.  
*The **accessibility** of his work helped to popularize modern art.*
- accessible** Easy to get along with or talk to; friendly.  
*An **accessible** and genial man.*
- affair** A sexual relationship between two people, one or both of whom are married to someone else.  
*The party was quite an **affair**.*
- approachable** Capable of being read with comprehension.  
*A site **approachable** from a branch of the Niger.*
- attainable** Able to be attained; achievable.  
*Choose an **attainable** goal.*
- availability** The quality of being able to be used or obtained.  
*Turkey producers had been losing sales because of the all year round **availability** of beef.*



<b>available</b>	(of a person) not otherwise occupied; free to do something. <i>Community health services <b>available</b> to Londoners.</i>
<b>communicate</b>	Convey or transmit (an emotion or feeling) in a non-verbal way. <i>He <b>communicated</b> his anxieties to the psychiatrist.</i> A bold challenge.
<b>confrontation</b>	<i>Four months of violent <b>confrontation</b> between government and opposition forces.</i>
<b>conjugal</b>	Relating to marriage or the relationship between a married couple. <i><b>Conjugal</b> loyalty.</i>
<b>connect</b>	Make a logical or causal connection. <i>The planes don't <b>connect</b> and you will have to wait for four hours.</i>
<b>connected</b>	Wired together to an alarm system. <i>First check to see whether the appliance is <b>connected</b>.</i>
<b>convenient</b>	Large and roomy convenient is archaic in this sense. <i>I phoned your office to confirm that this date is <b>convenient</b>.</i>
<b>entree</b>	The act of entering. <i>She made a graceful <b>entree</b> into the ballroom.</i>
<b>freely</b>	Not under the control of another; as one wishes. <i>Air can <b>freely</b> circulate.</i>
<b>handy</b>	Ready to hand. <i>The brush is <b>handy</b> for vacuuming stubborn dust and dirt.</i>
<b>introduce</b>	Put or introduce into something. <i><b>Introduce</b> a rule.</i>
<b>involvement</b>	The condition of sharing in common with others (as fellows or partners etc). <i>He escaped <b>involvement</b> in the accident.</i>
<b>liaison</b>	A usually secretive or illicit sexual relationship. <i>The head porter works in close <b>liaison</b> with the reception office.</i>
<b>link</b>	Link with or as with a yoke. <i>She <b>linked</b> up with an artistic group.</i>
<b>meet</b>	Meet by design be present at the arrival of. <i><b>Meet</b> a violent death.</i>
<b>network</b>	Broadcast a programme on a network. <i>The <b>networks</b> compete to broadcast important sports events.</i>
<b>obtainable</b>	Able to be obtained. <i>Savings of up to 50 percent are <b>obtainable</b>.</i>

<b><u>phone</u></b>	Phonetics an individual sound unit of speech without concern as to whether or not it is a phoneme of some language. <i>It was not the typing but the ear<b>phones</b> that she disliked.</i>
<b>platonic</b>	Free from physical desire. <i>Their relationship is purely <b>platonic</b>.</i>
<b>relationship</b>	A relation between people relationship is often used where relation would serve as in the relationship between inflation and unemployment but the preferred usage of relationship is for human relations or states of relatedness. <i>The landlord tenant <b>relationship</b>.</i>
<b><u>reunite</u></b>	Unify again, as of a country. <i>The three friends <b>reunited</b> in 1959.</i>
<b>scandal</b>	The outrage or anger caused by a scandalous action or event. <i>It s a <b>scandal</b> that many older patients are dismissed as untreatable.</i>
<b>tangency</b>	(electronics) a junction where things (as two electrical conductors) touch or are in physical contact.
<b>usable</b>	Fit or ready for use or service. <i><b>Usable</b> byproducts.</i>
