## Contemporaneous as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Contemporaneous" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “contemporaneous” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Of the same period.*
- *Occurring in the same period of time.*
- *Existing at or occurring in the same period of time.*

- *A rise in interest rates is often contemporaneous with an increase in inflation.*

| <b>concurrent</b>          | (of two or more prison sentences) to be served at the same time.<br><i>He received <b>concurrent</b> sentences of two years imprisonment for each of his two convictions.</i> |
| <b>concurrently</b>        | At the same time; simultaneously.<br><i><b>Concurrently</b> with the conference an exhibition of things associated with Rutherford was held.</i>                              |
| <b><u>contemporary</u></b> | Following modern ideas in style or design.<br><i><b>Contemporary</b> ceramics by leading potters.</i>   |
| <b>enroll</b>              | Register formally as a participant or member.   |
| <b><u>equalize</u></b>     | Level the score in a match by scoring a goal.<br><i>Britain is required to <b>equalize</b> pension rights between men and women.</i>  |
| <b><u>equate</u></b>       | Cause (two or more things) to be the same in quantity or value.<br><i>You cannot <b>equate</b> success in financial matters with greed.</i>                                   |
| <b>event</b>               | Something that happens at a given place and time.<br><i>The momentous political <b>events</b> of the late 1980s.</i>  |
| <b>exist</b>               | Have an existence be extant.<br><i>Two conflicting stereotypes of housework <b>exist</b> in popular thinking.</i>   |
| <b>hap</b>                 | An accidental happening.<br><i>He recorded all the little <b>haps</b> and <b>mishaps</b> of his life.</i>   |

| <b>incidental</b>           | An incidental expense event etc.<br><i>Labor problems <b>incidental</b> to a rapid expansion.</i>   |
| <b>incidentally</b>         | Introducing a different topic; in point of fact.<br><i>The infection was discovered only <b>incidentally</b> at post mortem examination.</i>  |
| <b>occur</b>                | To be found to exist.<br><i>Radon <b>occurs</b> naturally in rocks such as granite.</i>   |
| <b>recent</b>               | Having happened, begun, or been done not long ago; belonging to a past period comparatively close to the present.<br><i>His <b>recent</b> trip to Africa.</i>   |
| <b><u>simultaneous</u></b>  | Occurring, operating, or done at the same time.<br><i>A <b>simultaneous</b> withdrawal of troops.</i>   |
| <b>simultaneously</b>       | At the same time.<br><i>The telethon was broadcast <b>simultaneously</b> on 31 US networks.</i>   |
| <b><u>sync</u></b>          | Make synchronous and adjust in time or manner.<br><i>The flash needs to be <b>synced</b> to your camera.</i>  |
| <b>synchronism</b>          | The relation that exists when things occur at the same time.  |
| <b><u>synchronize</u></b>   | Cause to occur or operate at the same time or rate.<br><i>Their breathing slowly <b>synchronized</b>.</i>   |
| <b>synchronous</b>          | Making or denoting an orbit around the earth or another celestial body in which one revolution is completed in the period taken for the body to rotate about its axis.<br><i>Glaciations were approximately <b>synchronous</b> in both hemispheres.</i> |
