allegation	A claim or assertion that someone has done something illegal or wrong, typically one made without proof. An allegation of malpractice.
arguing	A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement.
<u>argument</u>	An independent variable associated with a function or proposition and determining its value For example in the expression y F x x the arguments of the function F are x and x and the value is y. <i>I ve had an argument with my father.</i>
claim	An application for compensation under the terms of an insurance policy. <i>His claim that he was innocent.</i>
competition	Interaction between animal or plant species, or individual organisms, that are attempting to gain a share of a limited environmental resource. <i>A beauty competition</i> .



contestation	A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement. Ideological contestation over social policy in the European Union.
<u>controversy</u>	Prolonged public disagreement or heated discussion. The design of the building has caused controversy .
<u>disagreement</u>	A conflict of people's opinions or actions or characters. There was some disagreement about the details.
disceptation	Disputation, debate, discussion; an instance of this.
disputation	A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement. <i>Scholastic disputations</i> .
dispute	A disagreement or argument. <i>He had a dispute with his wife.</i>
<u>plea</u>	A defendant's answer by a factual matter (as distinguished from a demurrer. Her plea of a headache was not entirely false.
<u>rivalry</u>	The act of competing as for profit or a prize. There always has been intense rivalry between the clubs.
submission	The condition of having submitted to control by someone or something else. <i>They were forced into submission</i> .
tilt	A combat between two mounted knights tilting against each other with blunted lances. <i>The court s tilt toward conservative rulings.</i>
<u>variance</u>	The fact or quality of being different, divergent, or inconsistent. <i>A zoning variance</i> .

argue	Present reasons and arguments. She was too tired to argue the point.
<u>argument</u>	An independent variable associated with a function or proposition and determining its value For example in the expression y F x x the arguments of the function F are x and x and the value is y. <i>He rejected the argument that keeping the facility would be costly.</i>
bellicose	Having or showing a ready disposition to fight. A mood of bellicose jingoism.
combative	Having or showing a ready disposition to fight. <i>He made some enemies with his combative style</i> .
competition	A business relation in which two parties compete to gain customers. <i>Business competition can be fiendish at times.</i>



Assert something as a position in an argument. Factions within the government were contend ing for the succession to the presidency.
Causing or likely to cause an argument; controversial. A central and contentious element of the book.
An inclination to be quarrelsome and contentious.
An occasion on which a winner is selected from among two or more contestants. A coalition was formed to contest the presidential elections.
Prolonged public disagreement or heated discussion. The design of the building has caused controversy .
Make a counterattack.
Open to doubt or debate. It is debatable whether the country is coming out of recession.
Have an argument about something. Last night s debate on the Education Bill.
The speech act of disagreeing or arguing or disputing. Disagreement s between parents and adolescents.
Lack of agreement or harmony between things. <i>We discorded commonly on two points.</i>
Fond of having heated arguments. It s a congenial hang out for disputatious academics.
A disagreement or argument about something important. An industrial dispute .
Disagreement that leads to discord. The mill was the cause of a dissension in 1620.
Be engaged in a fight carry on a fight. The men were fight ing.
Norwegian chemist noted for his research on organic molecules (1897-1981.
Prepare and issue for public distribution or sale. I like him though I have some issue s with the guy.
Of or relating to litigation. Our increasingly litigious society.
Of or involving strongly critical or disputatious writing or speech. A polemical essay.



<u>quarrel</u>	A heated argument or disagreement, typically about a trivial issue and between people who are usually on good terms. <i>They had a quarrel.</i>
quarrelsome	Given to or characterized by quarrelling. <i>Quarrelsome</i> when drinking.
<u>rivalry</u>	The act of competing as for profit or a prize. There always has been intense rivalry between the clubs.
row	The act of rowing as a sport. Her villa stood in a row of similar ones.
strife	Trouble or difficulty of any kind. Decades of civil strife .
<u>wrangle</u>	Have a long, complicated dispute or argument. An insurance wrangle is holding up compensation payments.
wrangling	An instance of intense argument (as in bargaining. Weeks of political wrangling .
