He relaxed in sleepy **contentedness**.

The achievement of something desired, promised, or predicted.

fulfilment The need to eliminate excess by the security forces in **fulfilment** of their

duties.

satisfaction The payment of a debt or fulfilment of an obligation or claim.

In full and final **satisfaction** of the claim.

blessedness The state of being blessed with divine favour.

bliss A state of extreme happiness.

The **bliss** of heaven.

A feeling of smug or uncritical satisfaction with oneself or one's

complacency achievements.

contentThe state of being contented with your situation in life.

They could read to their heart s content.

delectation Pleasure and delight.

They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our **delectation**.

delightTake delight in.

She took great **delight** in telling your story.



delighted Feeling or showing great pleasure.

We were **delighted** to see her.

A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion.

There was a look of **ecstasy** on his face.

enjoy

Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in.

The security forces **enjoy** legal immunity from prosecution.

enjoyable Affording satisfaction or pleasure.

The company was enjoyable.

euphoria

A feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness.

In his **euphoria** he had become convinced he could defeat them.

exult Feel extreme happiness or elation.

Who cannot **exult** in Spring.

exultant Triumphantly happy.

He waved to the **exultant** crowds.

felicity Intense happiness.

Domestic **felicity**.

glad Causing happiness.

Glad of the fire s warmth.

gladden Make glad.

The high childish laugh was a sound that **gladden**ed her heart.

Pleasure, especially when gained from the satisfaction of a desire.

gratification Dull repetitious work gives no gratification.

Yield (to); give satisfaction to.

gratify

She was gratified to see the shock in Jim's eyes.

State of well-being characterized by emotions ranging from contentment to

happiness intense joy.

She struggled to find **happiness** in her life.

Used in greetings.

I m **happy** with his performance.

A thing that causes joy.

A joy to behold.

Full of or characterized by joy.

Joyous Joyous laughter.

merriment Gaiety and fun.

Her eyes sparkled with **merriment**.

It is someone's choice to do something.

What type of fish is this **please**.



pleasure Sexual gratification.

The touch of his fingers gave her such **pleasure**.

rapture Expressions of intense pleasure or enthusiasm about something.

People will be **rapture**d out of automobiles as they are driving along.

Used ironically to draw attention to a strange characteristic, especially a

rejoice name.

The guard **rejoice**d in the name of Blossom.

What is felt to be owed or due to one, especially in reparation of an injustice

satisfaction or wrong.

I looked round with **satisfaction**.

satisfy

Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condtion ro restriction.

There was insufficient collectoral to action the loan.

There was insufficient collateral to **satisfy** the loan.

thrilled Feeling intense pleasurable excitement.
