Associations of "Contextual" (30 Words)

appertain	Relate to; concern. <i>The answers generally appertain to improvements in standard of service.</i>
awareness	Concern about and well-informed interest in a particular situation or development. <i>The crash intruded on his awareness.</i>
background	Provide with background. <i>They got a bad connection and could hardly hear one another over the background signals.</i>
cognitive	Of or being or relating to or involving cognition. <i>The cognitive processes involved in reading.</i>
comprehensible	Able to be understood; intelligible. <i>An idea comprehensible to the average mind.</i>
concern	Have a specific connection with or responsibility for. <i>A racially integrated business concern.</i>
context	Discourse that surrounds a language unit and helps to determine its interpretation. <i>The proposals need to be considered in the context of new European directives.</i>
environmental	Concerned with the ecological effects of altering the environment. <i>Acid rain may have caused major environmental damage.</i>
equilibrium	A sensory system located in structures of the inner ear that registers the orientation of the head. <i>The equilibrium level of income.</i>
equipoise	Equality of distribution. <i>This temporary equipoise of power.</i>
equity	The value of a mortgaged property after deduction of charges against it. <i>People who have built up a significant amount of equity in their homes.</i>

homograph	Two words are homographs if they are spelled the same way but differ in meaning e g fair.
impartiality	Equal treatment of all rivals or disputants; fairness. <i>Entries had to be submitted under a pseudonym to ensure impartiality in the judging process.</i>
interlinear	Written between lines of text. <i>A Greek English interlinear New Testament.</i>
linguistics	The scientific study of language and its structure including the study of grammar syntax and phonetics Specific branches of linguistics include sociolinguistics dialectology psycholinguistics computational linguistics comparative linguistics and structural linguistics.
linked	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
neutrality	Tolerance attributable to a lack of involvement. <i>During the war Switzerland maintained its neutrality.</i>
<u>objectivity</u>	Judgment based on observable phenomena and uninfluenced by emotions or personal prejudices. <i>The piece lacked any objectivity.</i>
palimpsest	A manuscript or piece of writing material on which later writing has been superimposed on effaced earlier writing. <i>Sutton Place is a palimpsest of the taste of successive owners.</i>
perceptual	Relating to the ability to interpret or become aware of something through the senses. <i>A patient with perceptual problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
<u>pertain</u>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>My remark pertained to your earlier comments.</i>
recognize	Accept (someone) to be what is claimed or accept his power and authority. <i>The best student was recognized by the Dean.</i>
<u>relate</u>	Feel sympathy for or identify with. <i>Kids related to him because he was so rebellious.</i>
same	Same in identity. <i>He gave me five dollars same as usual.</i>
semiconscious	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.
setting	A piece of vocal or choral music composed for particular words. <i>A setting of Yevtushenko s bleak poem.</i>
synonymous	(of a word or phrase) having the same meaning as another word or phrase in the same language. <i>His deeds had made his name synonymous with victory.</i>

view
