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## Associations of "Contextual" (30 Words)

<b>appertain</b>	Relate to; concern. <i>The answers generally <b>appertain</b> to improvements in standard of service.</i>
<b>awareness</b>	Concern about and well-informed interest in a particular situation or development. <i>The crash intruded on his <b>awareness</b>.</i>
<b>background</b>	Provide with background. <i>They got a bad connection and could hardly hear one another over the <b>background</b> signals.</i>
<b>cognitive</b>	Of or being or relating to or involving cognition. <i>The <b>cognitive</b> processes involved in reading.</i>
<b>comprehensible</b>	Able to be understood; intelligible. <i>An idea <b>comprehensible</b> to the average mind.</i>
<b>concern</b>	Have a specific connection with or responsibility for. <i>A racially integrated business <b>concern</b>.</i>
<b>context</b>	Discourse that surrounds a language unit and helps to determine its interpretation. <i>The proposals need to be considered in the <b>context</b> of new European directives.</i>
<b>environmental</b>	Concerned with the ecological effects of altering the environment. <i>Acid rain may have caused major <b>environmental</b> damage.</i>
<b>equilibrium</b>	A sensory system located in structures of the inner ear that registers the orientation of the head. <i>The <b>equilibrium</b> level of income.</i>
<b>equipoise</b>	Equality of distribution. <i>This temporary <b>equipoise</b> of power.</i>
<b>equity</b>	The value of a mortgaged property after deduction of charges against it. <i>People who have built up a significant amount of <b>equity</b> in their homes.</i>

<b>homograph</b>	Two words are homographs if they are spelled the same way but differ in meaning e.g. fair.
<b>impartiality</b>	Equal treatment of all rivals or disputants; fairness. <i>Entries had to be submitted under a pseudonym to ensure <b>impartiality</b> in the judging process.</i>
<b>interlinear</b>	Written between lines of text. <i>A Greek English <b>interlinear</b> New Testament.</i>
<b>linguistics</b>	The scientific study of language and its structure including the study of grammar syntax and phonetics. Specific branches of linguistics include sociolinguistics, dialectology, psycholinguistics, computational linguistics, comparative linguistics, and structural linguistics.
<b>linked</b>	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<b>neutrality</b>	Tolerance attributable to a lack of involvement. <i>During the war Switzerland maintained its <b>neutrality</b>.</i>
<b>objectivity</b>	Judgment based on observable phenomena and uninfluenced by emotions or personal prejudices. <i>The piece lacked any <b>objectivity</b>.</i>
<b>palimpsest</b>	A manuscript or piece of writing material on which later writing has been superimposed on effaced earlier writing. <i>Sutton Place is a <b>palimpsest</b> of the taste of successive owners.</i>
<b>perceptual</b>	Relating to the ability to interpret or become aware of something through the senses. <i>A patient with <b>perceptual</b> problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
<b>pertain</b>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>My remark <b>pertained</b> to your earlier comments.</i>
<b>recognize</b>	Accept (someone) to be what is claimed or accept his power and authority. <i>The best student was <b>recognized</b> by the Dean.</i>
<b>relate</b>	Feel sympathy for or identify with. <i>Kids <b>related</b> to him because he was so rebellious.</i>
<b>same</b>	Same in identity. <i>He gave me five dollars <b>same</b> as usual.</i>
<b>semiconscious</b>	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.
<b>setting</b>	A piece of vocal or choral music composed for particular words. <i>A <b>setting</b> of Yevtushenko's bleak poem.</i>
<b>synonymous</b>	(of a word or phrase) having the same meaning as another word or phrase in the same language. <i>His deeds had made his name <b>synonymous</b> with victory.</i>
