Definitions of "Continually" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “continually” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Without interruption; constantly.*
- *Seemingly without interruption.*
- *Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly.*

Synonyms of "Continually" as an adverb (7 Words)

again and again Anew.

constantly Continuously over a period of time; always.
Constantly *kind and gracious.*

continuously Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals.
*Their performance has **continuously** improved.*

frequently Regularly or habitually; often.
*They go abroad **frequently**.*

regularly On a habitual basis; usually.
*The reunion has taken place **regularly** every two years.*

repeatedly Over and over again; constantly.
*They have been warned **repeatedly** with no effect.*

round the clock From beginning to end; throughout.

Usage Examples of "Continually" as an adverb

- *This information is continually updated.*
- *I was continually moving around.*

boundless Seemingly boundless in amount number degree or especially extent.

***Changeless** truths.*

consistent Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts.

constantly Without interruption.
*He was **constantly** on her mind.*

continued Without a break in continuity; ongoing.
*He asked for their **continued** support.*

continuously With unflagging resolve.
*These images loop **continuously**.*

endless Infinitely great in number.
*We smoked **endless** cigarettes.*

endlessly Without bounds.
*An **endlessly** fascinating subject.*

eternal Tiresomely long; seemingly without end.
***Eternal** quarreling.*

<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Ever busy.</i>
<u>every</u>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i>Every two hours.</i>
<u>forever</u>	For all future time; for always. <i>It took forever to get a passport.</i>
<u>grinding</u>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>Grinding poverty.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption; constantly. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>The boundless regions of the infinite.</i>
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>We got bogged down in interminable discussions.</i>
<u>invariably</u>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.</i>
perpetual	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>Their perpetual money worries.</i>
perpetually	Without interruption. <i>Perpetually hungry teenage boys.</i>
<u>perpetuity</u>	The state or quality of lasting forever. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
persistent	Retained; not shed. <i>Persistent leaves remain attached past maturity.</i>
<u>steadily</u>	In a regular and even manner. <i>It rained steadily all night.</i>
<u>steady</u>	Make or become steady. <i>Sales remain steady.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
unlimited	(of a company) not limited. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
