Definitions of "Continually" as an adverb

- Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly.

<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Ever</i> busy.
<u>every</u>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i>Every two hours.</i>
<u>forever</u>	For all future time; for always. It took forever to get a passport.
<u>grinding</u>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>Grinding</i> poverty.
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. The incessant beat of the music.
incessantly	Without interruption; constantly. She talked about him incessantly .
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>The boundless regions of the infinite</i> .
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically. We got bogged down in interminable discussions.
<u>invariably</u>	Without variation or change, in every case. Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.
perpetual	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. Their perpetual money worries.
perpetually	Without interruption. Perpetually hungry teenage boys.
<u>perpetuity</u>	The state or quality of lasting forever. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
persistent	Retained; not shed. Persistent leaves remain attached past maturity.
<u>steadily</u>	In a regular and even manner. It rained steadily all night.
<u>steady</u>	Make or become steady. Sales remain steady .
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
unlimited	(of a company) not limited. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not</i> unlimited .
