## Continually as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Continually" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “continually” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Without interruption; constantly.*
- *Seemingly without interruption.*
- *Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly.*

### Synonyms of "Continually" as an adverb (7 Words)

**again and again** Anew.

**constantly** Continuously over a period of time; always.  
**Constantly** kind and gracious.

**continuously** Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals.  
*Their performance has **continuously** improved.*

**frequently** Regularly or habitually; often.  
*They go abroad **frequently**.*

**regularly** On a habitual basis; usually.  
*The reunion has taken place **regularly** every two years.*

**repeatedly** Over and over again; constantly.  
*They have been warned **repeatedly** with no effect.*

**round the clock** From beginning to end; throughout.

<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i><b>Ever</b> busy.</i>
<b><u>every</u></b>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i><b>Every</b> two hours.</i>
<b><u>forever</u></b>	For all future time; for always. <i>It took <b>forever</b> to get a passport.</i>
<b><u>grinding</u></b>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i><b>Grinding</b> poverty.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b><u>infinite</u></b>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>The boundless regions of the <b>infinite</b>.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.</i>
<b><u>invariably</u></b>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>Ranch meals are <b>invariably</b> big and hearty.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>Their <b>perpetual</b> money worries.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	Without interruption. <i><b>Perpetually</b> hungry teenage boys.</i>
<b><u>perpetuity</u></b>	The state or quality of lasting forever. <i>He did not believe in the <b>perpetuity</b> of military rule.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Retained; not shed. <i><b>Persistent</b> leaves remain attached past maturity.</i>
<b><u>steadily</u></b>	In a regular and even manner. <i>It rained <b>steadily</b> all night.</i>
<b><u>steady</u></b>	Make or become steady. <i>Sales remain <b>steady</b>.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Man s <b>unceasing</b> warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b>unlimited</b>	(of a company) not limited. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not <b>unlimited</b>.</i>
