## Associations of "Contradicted" (30 Words)

<b>abnegation</b>	Renunciation of your own interests in favor of the interests of others. <i>People are capable of <b>abnegation</b> and unselfishness.</i>
<b><a href="#">belie</a></b>	Fail to fulfil or justify (a claim or expectation). <i>His lively alert manner <b>belied</b> his years.</i>
<b>conflicting</b>	In disagreement- John Morley. <i><b>Conflicting</b> opinions.</i>
<b>contravene</b>	Go against, as of rules and laws. <i>He <b>contravened</b> the Official Secrets Act.</i>
<b>contravention</b>	An action which offends against a law, treaty, or other ruling. <i>There were repeated raids by one side upon the other in <b>contravention</b> of treaty terms.</i>
<b>controvert</b>	Prove to be false or incorrect. <i>Subsequent work from the same laboratory <b>controverted</b> these results.</i>
<b><a href="#">deny</a></b>	Deny oneself something restrain especially from indulging in some pleasure. <i>There was no way that I was going to <b>deny</b> myself ice cream.</i>
<b><a href="#">disavow</a></b>	Refuse to acknowledge; disclaim knowledge of; responsibility for, or association with. <i>Her husband <b>disavowed</b> her after 30 years of marriage and six children.</i>
<b>disavowal</b>	The denial of any responsibility or support for something; repudiation. <i>His <b>disavowal</b> of his previous writings.</i>
<b>disclaim</b>	Make a disclaimer about. <i>He <b>disclaimed</b> any responsibility.</i>
<b>disown</b>	Refuse to acknowledge or maintain any connection with. <i>Lovell s rich family had <b>disowned</b> him because of his marriage.</i>
<b>dispute</b>	Question whether (a statement or alleged fact) is true or valid. <i>He taught and <b>disputed</b> with local poets.</i>

<b>impugn</b>	Attack as false or wrong. <i>The father does not <b>impugn</b> her capacity as a good mother.</i>
<b>inadmissible</b>	Not deserving to be admitted. <i>An <b>inadmissible</b> interference in the affairs of the Church.</i>
<b>misrepresent</b>	Represent falsely. <i>This statement <b>misrepresents</b> my intentions.</i>
<b>negate</b>	Deny the existence of. <i>Alcohol <b>negates</b> the effects of the drug.</i>
<b>neutralize</b>	Make ineffective by counterbalancing the effect of. <i>The double agent was <b>neutralized</b>.</i>
<b>no</b>	Quantifier used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of. <i>His <b>no</b> was loud and clear.</i>
<b>nullify</b>	Declare invalid. <i>Judges were unwilling to <b>nullify</b> government decisions.</i>
<b>objection</b>	The act of expressing earnest opposition or protest. <i>They have raised no <b>objections</b> to the latest plans.</i>
<b>oppose</b>	Set into opposition or rivalry. <i>The board <b>opposed</b> his motion.</i>
<b>rebut</b>	Drive back or repel (a person or attack). <i>He had to <b>rebut</b> charges of acting for the convenience of his political friends.</i>
<b>rebuttal</b>	(law) a pleading by the defendant in reply to a plaintiff's surrejoinder.
<b>refutation</b>	The action of proving a statement or theory to be wrong or false. <i>He fails to give a clear <b>refutation</b> of the argument.</i>
<b>refute</b>	Prove to be false or incorrect. <i>His voice challenging his audience to rise and <b>refute</b> him.</i>
<b>reject</b>	Reject with contempt. <i>These explanations of criminal behaviour have been <b>rejected</b> by sociologists.</i>
<b>renounce</b>	Turn away from; give up. <i>Isabella offered to <b>renounce</b> her son's claim to the French Crown.</i>
<b>repudiate</b>	Refuse to fulfil or discharge (an agreement, obligation, or debt). <i>The woman <b>repudiated</b> the divorce settlement.</i>
<b>rescind</b>	Cancel officially. <i>The government eventually <b>rescinded</b> the directive.</i>
