abnegation	Renunciation of your own interests in favor of the interests of others. <i>People are capable of abnegation and unselfishness.</i>
<u>belie</u>	Fail to fulfil or justify (a claim or expectation. <i>His lively alert manner belied his years.</i>
conflicting	In disagreement- John Morley. <i>Conflicting</i> opinions.
contravene	Go against, as of rules and laws. <i>He contravened the Official Secrets Act.</i>
contravention	An action which offends against a law, treaty, or other ruling. There were repeated raids by one side upon the other in contravention of treaty terms.
controvert	Prove to be false or incorrect. Subsequent work from the same laboratory controvert ed these results.
<u>deny</u>	Deny oneself something restrain especially from indulging in some pleasure. There was no way that I was going to deny myself ice cream.
<u>disavow</u>	Refuse to acknowledge; disclaim knowledge of; responsibility for, or association with. <i>Her husband disavowed her after 30 years of marriage and six children.</i>
disavowal	The denial of any responsibility or support for something; repudiation. <i>His disavowal of his previous writings.</i>
disclaim	Make a disclaimer about. <i>He disclaimed any responsibility.</i>
disown	Refuse to acknowledge or maintain any connection with. Lovell s rich family had disown ed him because of his marriage.
dispute	Question whether (a statement or alleged fact) is true or valid. <i>He taught and disputed with local poets.</i>



impugn	Attack as false or wrong. The father does not impugn her capacity as a good mother.
inadmissible	Not deserving to be admitted. An inadmissible interference in the affairs of the Church.
misrepresent	Represent falsely. This statement misrepresent s my intentions.
negate	Deny the existence of. Alcohol negate s the effects of the drug.
<u>neutralize</u>	Make ineffective by counterbalancing the effect of. The double agent was neutralize d.
<u>no</u>	Quantifier used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of. <i>His no was loud and clear.</i>
<u>nullify</u>	Declare invalid. Judges were unwilling to nullify government decisions.
<u>objection</u>	The act of expressing earnest opposition or protest. They have raised no objection s to the latest plans.
oppose	Set into opposition or rivalry. The board oppose d his motion.
rebut	Drive back or repel (a person or attack. <i>He had to rebut charges of acting for the convenience of his political friends.</i>
<u>rebuttal</u>	(law) a pleading by the defendant in reply to a plaintiff's surrejoinder.
refutation	The action of proving a statement or theory to be wrong or false. <i>He fails to give a clear refutation of the argument.</i>
<u>refute</u>	Prove to be false or incorrect. His voice challenging his audience to rise and refute him.
reject	Reject with contempt. These explanations of criminal behaviour have been reject ed by sociologists.
<u>renounce</u>	Turn away from; give up. Isabella offered to renounce her son s claim to the French Crown.
repudiate	Refuse to fulfil or discharge (an agreement, obligation, or debt. The woman repudiate d the divorce settlement.
rescind	Cancel officially. The government eventually rescind ed the directive.
